ROBERT STREB (-14)

Q. Robert, so many good shots out there today, we don't have time to go through them all, but tell me about your thought process with that approach, thinking about the hole on 18. Lot of wind, lot of water out there and you just stick it to 10 feet.

ROBERT STREB: It wasn't exactly by design. I figured I was going to go 25 feet past the hole, think I missed it a little bit. Got pretty lucky there. Wish I would have capitalized, but take my 4 and scoot on down the road.

Q. Absolutely. That 63 ties a career low for you. What about those bank shots you hit at 13 and again at 17 where you used the contours of the green to feed it down toward the cup?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, 13 was a little bit fortunate, wasn't exactly aiming over there, and then 17 I was just trying to get something on that hill just to feed it down to the hole and obviously both worked out really well.

Q. You have so many good memories here, you're an RSM Classic winner. Will you go back to those memories when you tee off on Saturday and the final round with some good thoughts?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, probably so since we'll be back over on Seaside. I think it's supposed to be a little bit breezy tomorrow, maybe the next day, so might be a little different, but should be a lot like the last two days.

Q. What did you learn from the weekend of your win here a few years ago?

ROBERT STREB: That's a good question. I was a long way out of it. Just got on a hot run there at the end and ended up in the right place. The field was really congested and it will probably be really congested this week, too, and a lot of guys will be in it.

Q. You can bend stats any way you want, but the last four winners here at RSM have led after 36 holes. Do you take anything from that stat?

ROBERT STREB: I don't want to be the one that breaks it. No, not really. There's still a lot of golf left, still got to go play and we'll see what happens.
