Q. Jason, a round of 67. You just talked about how difficult those conditions are. I spoke with you earlier in the week and you clearly were not happy with your game and it was specifically about your putting. I just looked at your stats, strokes gained putting, you're in the top-10. What do you take from that?

JASON DAY: Yeah, actually funny. I mean, I have been very disappointed over the last year and a half with my putting and this week it's just -- I've seen glimpses of my old putting back in the game over the last few months, which has been good. It's been really streaky. This week's been awesome, got a really good feel with my stroke right now. I've been reading the putts really well. The speed control has been the main issue for me. It's just if you don't have speed control, you don't read the line and (inaudible.)

Q. What do you want to see tomorrow to close your season on a high note?

JASON DAY: (Inaudible) would be nice. I mean, I've just been obviously struggling this week trying to get on to the fairways and give myself the opportunities from that. So I've been very patient. I don't think -- I think I've made maybe three bogeys over the last three days, so it's pretty solid. Short game's nice, putting's good. If I could give myself more opportunities, I feel like I could give myself a shot at winning.
