ANDREW LANDRY (-11)

Q. Do you prefer these windy conditions to carry over to tomorrow?

ANDREW LANDRY: Absolutely. I feel like the conditions are a little bit tougher. If you're controlling your golf ball, it helps out a bunch, so you know, some nerves can be throwing that stuff off as well. Yeah, I definitely want it windy again tomorrow. Know that there's a little bit of rain showers, so the harder, the better. I just got off to a really good start and hit a 6-iron today just got dialed in quick with the way -- how much wind to play really. Hit a good shot on the first and second hole and started off birdie-birdie, so it's good to get off to a really good start on those two holes.

Q. I know the easy answer here is "golf," but what is the difference the last three rounds versus last Friday at Augusta? I know it's a vastly different tournament and a vastly different golf course, but in your mind, what was the difference?

ANDREW LANDRY: Attitude. My attitude didn't really get me last week, I was still enjoying myself. It's hard not to enjoy yourself around Augusta National. It's just one of those weeks where nothing really clicked. I've had some good success here in the past with the SEC Championships I think in 2018 or '17 -- no, '18, I think I finished fourth. I've had good success here. It's a golf course I really love and I've been here a handful of times and it's just fun.

Q. Going back to college, since you went there, we have shown earlier in the broadcast a baby-faced Andrew Landry going against Bronson Burgoon. What do you remember about that match?

ANDREW LANDRY: It was awesome. I think that it was kind of heartbreak on the last hole with him hitting that shot, me being in the fairway and he was in the right rough, but that's just typical golf for you.

Like I told my coach at the time, I was like, "This isn't going to be the last time that this happens to me." You know, at least we became good friends after that, and we always joke around with each other, he's got a ring and I don't. I've always wanted to have an NCAA Championship ring, but I was a little short.

Q. And you pointed out you had the mullet then, too.

ANDREW LANDRY: That's right, I did have that mullet. It was nice.
