



ROBERT STREB (-19, won 2nd playoff hole)

Q. Robert, congratulations. What a finish for you. Let's go back to the round. You have putts that just barely miss at 13 and 15, at 16. Did you know you had to make on the par-3 17th?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, I really felt like I needed to make those ones on 15 and 16 as well. I didn't know what Kiz was doing, but I knew he was playing really well along with some other guys.

Yeah, 17 I felt like had to go in. I didn't know if he was going to get to 20 or not and I felt like it had to go in if I wanted a chance.

Q. And a little different strategy throughout the week so far as what you hit off of 18 tee. Was it 3-wood during regulation?

ROBERT STREB: No.

Q. It was just a driver that wound up 189 yards away?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah. I didn't get a lot of it and it kind of hit into that upslope. Yeah, it wasn't where I thought it would be, but it was in the short grass and I was able to have a chance at it.

Q. Great putt here on 18 to prolong the playoff, then tell me about your approach on the second playoff hole.

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, I was pretty happy it got over the bunker. I thought I hit it in the same place. Was playing for a flyer, took a pitching wedge and just was hoping we got it right. It came out kind of hot and I was just hoping it would land soft and it did. Obviously I couldn't tell how far by the hole it went, but pretty happy it was that close.

Q. I know last year hadn't been the greatest season for you. What turned it around for you this week?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, it's been some battles the last few years. My putter got pretty hot the first day, second day, and then started hitting some better the last two days, hitting them closer and making some putts. I missed a few inside 10 feet coming in today, but other than that I putted really well.

Q. Can you walk us through the second shot on 18, what you were trying to

accomplish it?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, we had 158. Obviously it was a bit of a tee flip, see who was going first, but took a pitching wedge hoping for a flyer. Got the flyer and then fortunately it landed soft. I was kind of at the mercy of whatever, how little spin was on the ball and it panned out perfectly.

Q. When you look at how you played today, you didn't seem to have your best stuff off the tee. Were you going to take a lot from that that you still were able to come down the stretch and finish the way you did?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, it was a little squirrely there for a little while. I thought I got it righted pretty good yesterday and then just kind of lost it for a little while today. Fortunately, scrambled well enough to have a chance there at the end.

Q. How were the emotions different this time around than from the first time you won here?

ROBERT STREB: Trying to run in front all day to me's sometimes a little hard because you're not necessarily pedal to the metal. Maybe I should have been, but just trying to -- I don't know, just trying to kill the butterflies there the first couple holes and get into it.
