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**Q. Guys, good playing again today. Obviously find yourself in a little different position than yesterday, but still right in the thick of it. Do you want to just talk through how it went today out on the course?**

**KEVIN NA:** Yeah, alternate shot's a tough format. I don't know what these guys played that are leading, but we were saying anything better than 5 under was a good score. We fell one short of what our minimum was, but it's tough. When you're playing alternate shot, it's not the same obviously as a scramble, but it's a lot harder than it actually is than playing your own ball, but we did okay.

**SEAN O'HAIR:** Yeah, it's just hard to get rhythm. When you're playing alternate shot, you just can't -- it's just complete opposite of what you're used to. I think it's more like skill related as far as hitting a drive, hitting a long iron every now and then, hitting a putter every now and then. So I thought we did a good job.

We had one bogey today, which was more my fault, but I think if we made -- if I made a couple more putts, we had some opportunities to go a lot lower. But 11 under's just a phenomenal score and we're just going to have to go really low tomorrow.

**Q. Next question I guess, did you feel like you had some missed opportunities out there or were you scrambling a bit?**

**KEVIN NA:** We both hit some good putts that didn't go in. Some days it goes in, some days it doesn't. Tomorrow we're playing best ball. I think if we go extremely low, maybe extra holes.

**Q. Sean, you've won this a few times. What does five shots going into the final round look like?**

**SEAN O'HAIR:** It's going to be tough to catch those guys tomorrow. I mean, we're going to have to play perfect golf and they're going to have to mess up a little bit for us to have a chance. I love how we're both playing. I think if we can kind of get in a rhythm and get some momentum early and just kind of keep with it, I think we can shoot a low score tomorrow.

**KEVIN NA:** What do you think, 15 under have a chance?

**SEAN O'HAIR:** Yeah, yeah, something like that.

**Q. You're playing with them, too, so at least you can --**

**SEAN O'HAIR:** Yeah, those guys, obviously they're seasoned and they're playing great golf and we're just going to go out and have fun and see how low we can go.

**Q. Does it feel like it's easier to get in a rhythm in tomorrow's format than today's where you were kind of off and on, start and stop?**

**KEVIN NA:** Yeah, it's weird when you play only half the shots, just kind of standing by the side, oh, I hope this goes in. Instead of playing your own ball, you get more of a feel of you hit your ball so the next shot you get the feel -- it's a continuous rhythm that's going, but when you're hitting one shot and you sit off to the side, it's kind of weird to just sit in the pocket and then you go up on the green and you've got to hit a putt. It's a totally different feeling.

**SEAN O'HAIR:** Yeah, I think tomorrow, if we go out and every one of us has a look at birdie, we've got two looks at birdie every hole, I think that's going to definitely help out a lot. It's hard on alternate shot, you feel a lot of pressure sometimes to make a putt. Your partner hit one in there pretty tight and you've got to -- you don't want to miss it for the team, but we're playing our own ball so it's just normal golf for us. If we can both shoot some low scores tomorrow, I think we'll have a fun day.

**Q. You guys have been out here all week, you know how the course is playing. Do you have a number in mind tomorrow?**

**KEVIN NA:** Fifty-nine.

**SEAN O'HAIR:** Yeah, I think if we both shoot 6, 7 under par and just kind of ham-and-egg it pretty good, I think that's out there, for sure. He's putting great, I'm hitting the ball pretty well, so just be really aggressive and go for it.

**KEVIN NA:** The key is not to birdie the same hole.
