Q. Thoughts on today?

BRANDON WU: Yeah, I think today went really well. I definitely hit a lot of good shots, kind of similar to yesterday. But, yeah, it was kind of a grind. I missed a short putt kind of early on in the round, made a bogey I think on my fourth hole. I kind of just had to keep my head down and play well on the back. And yeah, luckily, I kept having good opportunities, so I converted on those.

Q. Is there a key hole or key shot that stands out as something you're most proud of or happy about today?

BRANDON WU: I think it's kind of similar to yesterday, just par saves. I think I had a good par save the middle of the back nine. I forget what hole it was. But chipping to the left, had about 10, 11 feet for par, made that to keep the momentum going, and yeah, keep the round intact.

Q. Talking about irons, you commented on your confidence with your iron game. Is that something that really is starting to come around even more so than it has been?

BRANDON WU: I think my irons have always kind of been the strength of my game, so that's always been there, which is good. I'm definitely hitting it really solid.

And yeah, as I mentioned before, I think judging the wind is kind of really key, figuring out a good number for that. And yeah, we have done a good job so far the past two days, so hopefully two more good days of that.

Q. And last question. Given your recent history on the Korn Ferry Tour with the wind and multiple runner-ups and a good Sunday at week at LECOM, how confident were you coming into this week?

BRANDON WU: Yeah, it felt good. I think my game is in a good place. It was good to see kind of the things I worked on during the off season paying off. And I did well last week, so that definitely gave me some confidence coming into this week. And yeah, I'm just trying to be out here, enjoying it, and I think take it one shot at a time and take it slow.

Q. A year ago obviously with COVID, everyone -- even after COVID, you were still kind of in limbo. And, I mean, you finally get that one chance at Price Cutter, and

you kind of have taken off with it.

BRANDON WU: Yeah. I think in a way that was a disappointing week. I think I had a three-shot lead going into the last day and ended up ninth. So no, I was definitely disappointed with that. But that was a huge week. Coming in there with just conditional status, scoring some points, and getting reshuffled and basically being able to play the rest of the year was huge. And I think, yeah, COVID definitely kind of pushed that start date back even further, so I think that was in July or even later than that, where I first got my first start. So, yeah, that was definitely an interesting time period.

Q. And then lastly, you have played 10 events, including last year. Are you not shocked at all, because you have seen the talent, the fact that Lee is up there, Taylor is up there, yourself, at the top of the leaderboard, like the amount of talent that's out there, now you guys get a chance, you guys are doing something with it?

BRANDON WU: Yeah, I think -- I was talking to someone about that yesterday. I think -- out of the, whatever, like six guys tied for second, I think three of us were from the Korn Ferry. So that was pretty cool to see. I think, yeah, it shows that we have all the skills and talent to compete at this level. And yeah, you just got to go out and play well.
