

**GREG CHALMERS**

**Q. Okay, Greg. No hole-in-ones today, but birdied the last two holes. That's going to make lunch taste a little sweeter. Just a few comments on the day today.**

**GREG CHALMERS:** Yeah, I kind of struggled on the front nine. The back nine, but my front nine. The wind was really blowing. I didn't have the greatest control, and my short game really held me in good stead. I made some nice saves from sort of 6, 8 feet for par. It's a little tricky to putt when the wind is blowing like this. And then I hung in there and started to see some better swings and better shots going into the back nine. There was a couple of par 5s there that we can reach. I picked both of those up. And then birdied 8 and 9 is a lovely way to finish.

**Q. Tell me a little bit about your confidence level coming into the week. I talked to you yesterday, listened to you out here a little bit. Just kind of -- confidence. You're obviously off to a great start in the two rounds.**

**GREG CHALMERS:** Yeah, I felt like I was hitting the ball okay. To be honest, I don't think my confidence was super high. It was sort of teetering on what's going to happen here. But you're always open to the idea that something good could happen, you will start playing better and start seeing some better shots. I played nicely in the practice rounds. I was really excited about how I was hitting the ball leading into -- I got here Sunday, so I had a lot of time to prepare, and I really hit the ball nicely on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday. But I have done that before and not done very well. So I really am pleased to say that what I saw early in the week has continued, and I actually have a couple of things I wish were a little better, but really pleased with how that's going.

**Q. Last question. Key shots that stood out today? Key shot or keyhole that you're really glad to have executed or --**

**GREG CHALMERS:** You know, believe it or not, it was the bogey on 15 or -- yeah, 15, the par 5. I drove it right, and I had a big rock in front of me. They got all these rocks in the sand area, and I tried to hook it around and I actually hit it into the rock. And it went 40 yards over my head back behind me. And then I hit 3-wood, 6-iron and had to hole an eight-footer for bogey. So I think that was the -- if there is a moment, that's one where your round could really go the wrong way. So -- and the thing could have gone anywhere off these rocks, so I was happy.
