

**TOM LEWIS (-10)**

**Q. Tom, great putt at the last, just under nine feet to save your par and remain bogey-free in two rounds. How proud are you of that?**

**TOM LEWIS:** That was big. I was saying to my caddie, John, it would be nice to go up and down and go bogey-free for two rounds. It's always nice doing that. I'm just happy, even if I did miss that putt, to be in the position I am going into the weekend. I'm really pleased with the way I've been playing.

**Q. Yesterday you said that anything could happen with you. Do you still feel that way or are you feeling a little bit more confident?**

**TOM LEWIS:** Yeah, there's a mixed feelings; confident, nervous. I'm going to make mistakes on the weekend, I know that, and it's just a matter of if I can hole putts at the right time to make important pars and obviously make as many birdies as possible. So I'm just going to be -- try and enjoy myself as much as I can whatever happens this weekend.

**Q. How much over the weekend would you be drawing on previous victories on the European Tour and especially Korn Ferry Tour?**

**TOM LEWIS:** I think the toughest round for me is going to be tomorrow. If I can go out and shoot under par, whatever happens, I'll be really happy with that. Some days I really feel quite relaxed a lot of the times when I've been in those positions. Tomorrow's going to be key for me.

**Q. Tom, what was it that she was referring to about you're not sure what you were going to get today?**

**TOM LEWIS:** I just said to Henni, like you never know with me. I could go out and shoot a great score and go win a tournament by five or I can go out and miss the cut from a position where I'm leading the tournament. I've done both and that's what I kind of was referring to with Henni.

**Q. Just for the whole year, right, you're kind of -- I looked at your stats, 11 cuts made, 11 cuts missed. Did you feel like such a clean first two rounds was coming like this?**

**TOM LEWIS:** No. I think obviously last week I had two good rounds as well. I was in a good position, made a mess of the Saturday and played better on the Sunday. I feel like tomorrow's going to be another opportunity for me to salvage that and get some confidence and try and play as aggressive as I can. I understand that when you go out late, the greens

are going to be a little more dicey, a little bubbly, but that's what you've got to do. I feel comfortable out there obviously shooting two rounds with no bogeys.

**Q. What was the key today for you to follow up such a good round, first round?**

**TOM LEWIS:** I holed some really key putts early on in the round for pars. My first hole on the 10th, I think I holed like a 12-footer for par there. I think I made another good sort of eight-footer on 12 and chipped in on 13. Those were the things that kept me motivated to carry on and play well for the rest of the round. It could easily have gone the other way, you know, by missing those putts and not chipping in. So it's a fine line between playing great and not.

**Q. You've won tournaments around the world. What would it mean to win on the PGA TOUR?**

**TOM LEWIS:** It would be excellent. I've obviously won on most tours all around the world and this is obviously the hardest tour to play on and to win on, but I'm a long way away from that. If I can, then awesome. My time will come when I'm ready.

**Q. You've got some pretty good history I believe at Royal St. George's. What's that all about?**

**TOM LEWIS:** Some courses suit certain people. I think around there, it obviously suits me. I've won tournaments there and I've done well in The Open last time, so to miss it this time around will hurt, but if I am able to make it, make it there, then I just really look forward to it.
