

JASON KOKRAK (-11)

Q. Jason, bogey-free 5-under 67, excellent day. If we can get some comments on your play.

JASON KOKRAK: Yeah, real solid day. Didn't put myself in any bad spots. Kind of left a few out there; missed a short one on 7, another short one on 14, but if you're giving yourself opportunities out here, that's the name of the game. It's a tree-lined golf course, if you drive it straight you're going to give yourself plenty of opportunities and I did just that. Made a nice one on 15, but I'd like to take a little bit more advantage, clean up some of the short irons into some of these greens.

Q. And good conditions for scoring out there. How was it?

JASON KOKRAK: It's great conditions. Still wet. I mean, only one day after kind of still standing water on the golf course, playing the ball up, but I thought the greens rolled a little better today, a little bit faster. I expect them to be a little bit firm, a little bit faster tomorrow.

Q. Troy up there at 15 under right now, so you'll have a little bit of work to do tomorrow. What is your game plan going into the final round?

JASON KOKRAK: Same as every other round, give myself a lot of opportunities. I think it's going to be a putting contest. Troy's a great putter and it's going to take everything I've got in the bag to catch him tomorrow if he continues the pace he's on.

Q. Two wins this year, how important is it to you to keep that momentum, and I know you want that third win pretty bad, too?

JASON KOKRAK: I mean, anytime -- I've had a hell of a season so far after not winning for that long, so I'm happy with where I'm at. I definitely want -- I like being in contention, I like where I'm at going into Sunday and hopefully he just doesn't get too far ahead of me.

Q. What is it like for you coming to the Midwest anytime you can play a tournament around your hometown?

JASON KOKRAK: It's awesome, I love playing in the Midwest. I love kind of the atmosphere, I love the greens, the grass. I'm just kind of used to everything up around this area. I enjoy it. I'm a Midwesterner at heart and I've got a lot of fans here this week.

Q. How many people that you maybe haven't seen in a while especially with some events last year, most of them without fans around this time, how many people are

you seeing here this year that maybe you haven't seen in a while?

JASON KOKRAK: I've had a couple family members drive up back and forth, it's only about two and a half hours door to door from my house over there towards Cleveland. A couple familiar faces that have come and visited me without asking for tickets or anything, they just kind of show up. It's kind of nice, a familiar face in the crowd is always a calming thing for me, and I hope a couple more people come tomorrow and support and hopefully I can give them quite a bit to cheer about.
