Q. It was tough out there, humid and hot. How did you work your way through today?

CAMERON CHAMP: I just stuck with it. I had my wife and my grandpa on my glove and I just kept looking at it realizing that's what I get to look forward to. And my grandfather, who I want to be. So again, I just really stuck with kind of what my approach was all week and what it's going to be for the rest of my career no matter the result. It freed me up. Obviously you have those excited nerves and adrenaline that you have to try to control, but again, being in these positions, that's something you have to accept and kind of learn how to deal with it.

Again, coming down the stretch I felt very calm, very relaxed and kind of in my zone. Obviously 18 made it a little interesting. I felt like I hit a great second shot from where that lie was, and obviously hit a great approach there into about two feet and made the putt.

Q. I don't think there's any question the difference this week, the putting. You're first in strokes gained: putting this week. You've been struggling with that, outside the top 200. What made the difference with your putting this week?

CAMERON CHAMP: Just myself. Again, it has nothing to do with technique, anything like that. It's just all been this year, just been a struggle within -- between the ears. I had to figure it out. Like I said in the previous interview, I had to figure out how to manage everything and how to manage my own expectations and what I want to do in life. I was just putting a lot of stress on myself and doing things that I usually wouldn't do and acting certain ways that I usually wouldn't act on the course. So I just had to take a step back and say, you know what, this has to stop. I've got to be more true to myself no matter what happens.

Q. Since your last win, you added Chad Reynolds to your bag as your caddie. How big of an impact has he made on you?

CAMERON CHAMP: It's huge. Chaddo stuck with me through a very rough year. It's been rough, to be quite honest, but again, we've been seeing the results slowly and slowly. The scores hadn't shown. But again, for me it's just more maturity as a person and, like I said, just having faith in myself more and trusting in what I'm capable of doing. Again, Chaddo's been behind me no matter what has happened.

Q. I know it just happened, your last win, you mentioned your grandfather right before he passed away. What does this win mean to you?

CAMERON CHAMP: Huge. Before I made that putt on the last, I was kneeling down and

just saying, "Thanks, Pops." It gets me emotional. I know he was looking down on us and just super appreciative of everything he's done for me.
