Q. Tommy, I know that bogey on the last was not the way that you wanted to finish today, but what are your takeaways from the round overall?

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: Yeah, it was good. Made quite a few birdies. I was happy to get off to a really fast start, 4 under through eight. I'd like to be a little more consistent off the tee, like to feel like -- I mean, even though two of my bogeys were three-putts, just tough like to control of the ball out of the rough. Not that I was in the rough all day, but I'd just like to feel a bit more comfortable off the tee. The last, yeah, made a bogey. I had a great putt, really thought I had made it, but overall, a solid start to the tournament.

Q. Fifteen and 16 you went eagle, birdie and then the horn blows. How much did that affect your momentum at that point?

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: No, it was all right. I just like hit this flat duff push on 17 like short right. I think 15 and 16 was great. Like obviously after a really fast start I sort of hit a dry patch and was back to 2 under, and then I think I played 15 great, rolled a nice putt in on 16, so it was really nice to sort of build something around there. Then came back and I felt like the putt on 17 was like a really nice putt to hole just coming back out when you had a wait. So there was plenty of like really good stuff in there and I've got to take that into the weekend.

Q. How did you spend the wait?

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: Sat with Rosie for a bit, had an Uncrustables and then sort of stayed warm. I honestly didn't -- I don't think any of us expected to go back out again. I think everybody was like ready to go. Like I had my car keys ready and everything and they said we were going back out. But I stayed pretty warm just in case, like I was loose and fell sort of right back into it when we came back out.
