

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER (-11)

Q. Bogey-free 64, five birdies in a row there on your final nine holes. What got it done out there?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I just kept the ball in play. I gave myself a lot of looks today. I don't think I missed very many greens, so that's really important around this place, just keep it in position. I did a good job of that today.

Q. Strategy-wise, with it being one of the shorter courses on the Tour and with there being a lot of trouble on both sides of the fairways, how much more thinking goes into planning out tee shots, fairway shots?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, I mean, there's definitely some thought that goes into it. It's not necessarily just bomb driver every time and I kind of appreciate that about this course. You really just have to put the ball in position, there's really no way around it.

Q. What are you looking forward to on the weekend? Anything you want to shore up in your game?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I would say I could hit a few more fairways. Other than that, I feel like I'm going a good job of getting the ball in position and giving myself a lot of looks. I feel like I burned a lot of edges the first couple days. Once those putts start falling a bit more, I think I'll start scoring a bit better.

Q. How different is it with the greens here versus -- you don't really see Paspalum very much?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, I can't remember the last time I played Paspalum outside of this course. It's a little different, but to me it reminds me a lot of Bermuda. The greens hold up really well as the days go on, they don't get crazy bumpy like you would get from a soft bent or a poa annua, so I think they're a pretty good surface to be putting on.
