Q. Given the conditions today versus what they are going to be tomorrow, do you feel like -- I mean, I know you had to go out and go low today, but did you see that number on the scorecard?

SEBASTIAN MUNOZ: No. To be honest, no, not that low. I felt great yesterday playing the pro-am, I felt like it was same conditions. I had basically the same weather for two days, so I knew I was hitting it good, and nothing, I just let it happen. It was good.

Q. Do you almost adjust? They say that it's hard to follow up a round like you had today, but tomorrow with tomorrow's conditions you probably don't have to do anything special, so it's almost a benefit for you?

SEBASTIAN MUNOZ: Yeah, I think it is. I haven't really looked at the forecast, I don't know how much it's going to blow tomorrow or if it's going to be cold or not, so I'm just kind of here right now and I'll adjust tomorrow and see what happens.

Q. Your general thoughts on the round as a whole?

SEBASTIAN MUNOZ: Really solid. I felt like I kind of let -- I didn't birdie either 1 or 2 and gladly hit a great shot on 3, made that one and then kind of got it going on 5, 6, 7. We made the turn, Corey was I think 6 under through nine, I was 5, so we were feeling it. We were kind of like feeding off each other. And that eagle on 15 kind of like made me like, was like all right, we can do this. Unfortunately didn't birdie 16 or 17, but really happy. Really, really happy.

Q. Are you aware that you didn't have a 5 on your scorecard and does that mean anything?

SEBASTIAN MUNOZ: Yeah, it's a thing I used to do back in college, it was the challenge of the day trying not to make a 5 on the scorecard with my fellow college team players. So that's when I know I play my best, when I don't make a 5.

Q. What did you do best out there today?

SEBASTIAN MUNOZ: I feel like my iron play was really good and my putting like from 10 feet was really good. I gave myself a ton of chances from the right places and I was reading the lines pretty good. Sometimes these greens, as good as they are, they're tough to read, so I feel like I did a really good job of like picturing what was with my speed and it worked pretty good.

Q. How long was the putt on 15?

SEBASTIAN MUNOZ: It was like 12 feet, I think, 11 feet.
