MARC LEISHMAN (-24)

Q. Guys, how would you -- Jason, how would you assess the day today?

JASON DAY: Man, it was -- we did a lot of good things today. I mean, anytime out of position or whatnot, we got up and down or kept our momentum going forward, which was nice. It was nice to be able to go bogey-free in that kind of format. Unfortunately I missed a few too many easy putts out there, but it was nice to be able to capitalize on the 18th. And Leish once again holing out on 7, amazing. In that kind of format it's nice to have eagles, it moves the needle a long way, especially when you're playing that way.

Q. Leish, why don't you talk about that hole-out on 7 if you could?

MARC LEISHMAN: Yeah, I was actually a little bit between clubs because the wind was into me. I was between lob wedge and sand wedge. Just ripped a lob wedge a bit lower and felt like I could land it a bit past it and maybe zip it back and give Jase a chance, because he hadn't really putted up until then except on the first hole. It's funny, the ones you hole are the ones you don't expect to go in. I wasn't expecting it to go in and then all of a sudden it disappears. It's nice. Something about this place that I've made a few shots the last couple years and hopefully we can keep that trend going tomorrow.

Q. In a tournament have you ever holed out from off the green this much?

MARC LEISHMAN: Probably not. No, it's been --

JASON DAY: Not with the shots that he's hit. He's hit whole pitch shots and wedge shots, it's quite unique. When it does come, it comes in droves like that. We've just got to keep the momentum going for tomorrow.

Q. This is a difficult one: How big is a three-shot lead going into a format like tomorrow? Is it like a five-shot lead if you were playing by yourself or is there a cushion there that you guys will think about?

MARC LEISHMAN: I think there's a good chance that before we even tee off we won't be leading. I think when you saw some of the scores today, Billy and Sam shot 10 under? That's unbelievable in foursomes, or modified foursomes given that. I think we're going to have to play good, make putts. Jase had some really tricky putts out there today. The putts you think you should make but when they're breaking that much, it's difficult. We've just got to both have chances and then hope we can make some putts, and maybe Jase can make a wedge shot tomorrow, we'll see.

JASON DAY: That would be nice, but I'm counting on him.

Q. I know playing your own ball and playing four-ball is like regular golf. Do you guys have like a strategy of like who maybe like will hit first?

JASON DAY: Honestly, really, both balls in play always, that beats any sort of aggressiveness, because I mean, for instance, you take 7 for instance, somebody lays up and you take driver and you hit it in the sand, that's one ball pretty much out of play. Two balls are always better than one, especially in that kind of format. More opportunities are better.

And hopefully they quicken up the greens a little bit for us. I know they were a little bit slower today. Like I said, the course has been great all week.

Yeah, you've got to have as many opportunities tomorrow because there's going to be a lot of birdies out there tomorrow. Different wind, northerly I think from last time I checked, so the course will play a little bit different. We'll see.

Q. Wasn't with Marc, but you did win the last time you played here. Does that help you guys at all?

JASON DAY: Well, I mean, when you definitely play in a four-ball format, there's a little bit of pressure off just because you have a teammate. So knowing that the guy will stand up there and hit one down the middle or get -- get them in range for birdie, you know, it's just there's a little bit of pressure just depending on where your player is, your partner is.

Tomorrow we've just got to focus. We're still 18 holes away from lifting the trophy, so got to stay on top of it. I've got a lot of faith in Marc going out there tomorrow knowing that he's going to keep it out in front of him and hit a lot of good quality shots and I'm going to try to do the same.
