

**Q. Jason, I'll start with this: You said you were going to ride his good play today and I think, Kevin, you came through pretty well. Just congratulations, guys. And Kevin, we'll start with that hot streak you got on.**

**KEVIN NA:** Yeah, we got off to a slow start, we needed something going and I started making some putts and hit some really good shots in there and it was just one after another after another and I just kept going. That chip-in on 9 was huge. I think that was a tough hole to birdie and for me to chip it in, I felt like we really gained one there. I think I made seven in a row and the eighth one I was in there close and he finally made one. On the back nine he told me -- I said, Hey, when are you going to show up? He said, I'll be there when you really need me, and he really showed up when I needed him.

**Q. When you stopped making birdies, he started. Was there a moment where it just kind of started to click a little bit, Jason?**

**JASON KOKRAK:** I was a little out of sorts hitting the ball right and the ball wasn't drawing back like normal, and I was just going through my checklist of stuff that I need to do in my golf swing that I work on with Drew. I was just getting a little bit up and underneath and I started staying behind it and hitting the ball really nice. Coming through, made a couple nice putts and nice two-putt birdie on the par 5. We ham-and-egged it. I leaned on him all on the front nine. He told me on nine he was going to hoop it after he missed the green and he sure did, it was right in the middle. It was pretty impressive stuff to watch that and kind of inspired me a little bit to get the train going. I made a couple myself.

**Q. Coming off the seasons both you guys had, third in the FedExCup and a number of wins you've had, how nice, how much momentum is there coming into -- even as light-hearted as it is, to carry that kind of resume into a week like this?**

**KEVIN NA:** He had more momentum than I did.

**JASON KOKRAK:** We both had nice years. Third in the FedExCup was unbelievable. He was one of the hottest players in the world at the moment. We've got good games that mirror each other pretty well out here and we have the same swing coach in Drew Steckel, so we have a lot of fun together. We play a lot of practice rounds and he brought that hot putter this week. I told him a couple weeks ago, I said, Just bring that putter and we'll be all right. So he definitely brought it this week. We had a lot of fun, too.

**KEVIN NA:** I just told him to bring the bomb and he brought the bomb. It was fun watching

him hit those bombs. It's nice when you play scramble, pick up the ball and walk up 30 yards and drop it. We had a good time. There were holes or moments that we weren't playing so well, but we never really got down, we just kind of said, don't -- you know, if one of us said, ah, sorry, no big deal, you know? We really had a good time and that was the key to playing well.

**Q. The putt on 18, Kevin, I know you probably thought that was going in, Jason, to --**

**KEVIN NA:** I wanted to give him the spotlight. I called D-Rob, his caddie to read the putt and he said three inches. When I first talked to Kenny, I was like maybe an inch or two.

**JASON KOKRAK:** Don't throw D-Rob under the bus.

**KEVIN NA:** I told D-Rob, You just wanted your man to have the winning putt, didn't you? No, that was awesome when he made that. I was actually a little nervous when he was putting.

**JASON KOKRAK:** Yeah, I'm not normally known for my putting. Drove it down in the fairway, probably the biggest fairway on Tour and hit that fairway and hit a nice pitching wedge from 155, a perfect number with a little help and rolled the putt right in. It was a perfect putt for me, right edge for a right-handed putter, so it was nice to see. I was hoping he would just walk it in and take the pressure off me, but he did enough, he pulled his own weight for sure.

**Q. Jason, just off the season you've had this year, picking up the wins you've picked up this year, how would you kind of characterize the year as a whole? What are you looking forward to towards 2022?**

**JASON KOKRAK:** Yeah, incredible year, incredible 15 months. I owe a lot of credit to D-Rob, we work great together. Drew Steckel and I work great together, work on keeping everything where it needs to be. I think it's just a little bit of confidence going a long way for a pro golfer. We have a fickle mind and I think if you get a little confidence, goes a long way. Especially me, if I drive it straight, it makes my life a lot easier and now I've got a putter that is heating up and it's staying hot, so I'm looking forward to what the future has to hold.

**Q. As you mentioned, Kevin, third in the FedExCup last year. I know you've been a little bit injured, but what's this year been like for you, and then rolling into the year 2022, what you're looking at.**

**KEVIN NA:** Yeah, it was an incredible year, my best FedExCup finish ever. Made it to the TOUR Championship and never really had any success at East Lake, but this year my game was right there. I was hot and I felt good. You know, right before the Playoffs Kenny's brother, my caddie's brother, passed away and it was kind of difficult for us, especially for Kenny, but he was there for me for the Playoffs and we felt like his brother was there throughout the Playoffs and that was one of the reasons why I played so well.

This was an incredible year. I know that the few tournaments in the fall that I didn't play well because of my injury, it was a bit frustrating sitting at home not being able to do anything with my rib, but I wasn't able to practice much leading into this. I had a few sessions with Drew at home. It was nice to have a good partner and rely on him a little bit and get the W.
