LUKE LIST (-15, won first playoff hole)

Q. It's been a long time coming, a lot of hard work, a lot of trials and tribulations to your career. How does this feel?

LUKE LIST: It feels unbelievable. I've worked really hard and to just have my family here means the world to me so my daughter could see that. It's all worth it for this moment.

Q. I know we talked about an hour ago, a little more than that, didn't know it was going to happen. What was going through your mind coming to 18?

LUKE LIST: I was just hoping for a playoff, and once I got that opportunity, I kind of found something when I was hitting balls and I just said, you know what, like I'm going to birdie this playoff hole whatever it takes.

Then I walked up and my ball's plugged and I said I'm still going to make birdie. I was super pumped. I've been through a playoff before and kind of knew what to expect with my body. I just stayed positive and it turned out.

Will's a heck of a player and just, he's going to win a million times out here and I'm just trying to get a few more before I'm done. But I'm super happy. Now I get to go to the Masters, which has been a long time coming, and I get to sleep in my own bed. I'm really excited.

Q. I'm here with Luke List, a winner on the PGA TOUR. Luke, just describe what's going through your mind right now after that incredible finish.

LUKE LIST: It still hasn't sunk in yet. I mean, I told myself I would just be happy to get into a playoff and I was super positive. Just kind of warming up for an hour again and told myself I was going to birdie the playoff hole if I got in. And even though that lie was plugged, I said okay, I can still make birdie. I was just super positive.

Q. There's a lot of time between you making that last putt on 18 and then going to the playoff hole. What were you doing? Who were you having conversations with?

LUKE LIST: Yeah, I was just hanging out with my wife and two kids, helped them. She's feeding our son, Harrison, and just kind of hanging out for a little bit. Then I started realizing once they got to 15, 16, just hit some balls and kind of shooting the breeze with my caddie and just trying to keep it light. The backdrop here's amazing, so just soaking that in. This is a special place. I know Jon Rahm talks about it being special, but I've always loved this place, too. To etch my name on this trophy means a lot.

Q. This will forever be a special place to you, and in the grand scheme of your career, what does this day mean to you?

LUKE LIST: Yeah, you know, a lot of people said it's a long time coming, and for me, I really worked hard in the offseason with my putting coach, Stephen Sweeney, and we found something. And my coach Jamie Mulligan has been with me for 10 years, so it's just a lot of hard work from a lot of people in my team and my family.
