Q. Well, Brandon, congratulations on a great week. Three-under 69 to finish it off. Just a few general comments about the week and how good you felt coming in.

BRANDON WU: I think my game's kind of been slowly progressing. This season hasn't quite gone as well as I would have liked, but I think last week I made a good push at Honda, I didn't play well the first round, but the second round I played really nicely so I think that's finally coming around. Yeah, I felt pretty comfortable out here in Puerto Rico because I had success last year, so it's nice to be back and play well this year.

Q. I was going to ask you about that. Your two top-10s on Tour both here in Puerto Rico. What is it about this place or the vibe or the course that you think suits your game on your mindset?

BRANDON WU: I think I'm a good wind player, so I feel in some challenging wind conditions I can flight it pretty well and I have good control of the ball, so I think that's a little bit to my advantage. Yeah, I think just good island vibes.

Q. And final question, you said things started coming together at Honda last week, obviously the runner-up finish here this week, moving ahead down to Valspar, I guess. You feel like it's going to continue heading in the right direction?

BRANDON WU: For sure. I think game is building nicely.

Q. A great week here, but obviously your heart and mind have been heavy this week. Just some thoughts on the tragedy coming out of Stanford?

BRANDON WU: Yeah, I think everyone from Stanford was thinking of Katie Meyer this week. Obviously just really, really sad and it really was heartbreaking to hear the news. She had so much energy. I remember watching their national championship run I think the end of 2019, I think penalty shoot-outs. It was hard not to fall in love with her spirit and energy. So I think that's pretty hard obviously for me, for everyone involved with Stanford, Stanford athletics, and, yeah, I just wish everyone the best.
