

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW

JAMES HAHN (-6)



Q. James, how would you characterize your round today?

JAMES HAHN: Solid. Hit a lot of good shots today, played smart, made a lot of good putts. Didn't really make too many mistakes mentally and anytime you're doing that, whether it's a rainy day like today or sunny and 80 degrees, I feel like you're doing a good thing.

Q. How difficult were the conditions out there?

JAMES HAHN: It was tough. Definitely the rain was a big factor in a lot of the shots that we hit, whether or not we're going for certain flags and kind of where to miss-hit out here because you never know what the ball's going to do when it's wet. Fairways were a premium today, so I felt like the most important shot for me was off the tee and then from there, if you're hitting fairways, it could be a green light or try to give yourself a good opportunity for birdie.

Q. You just said that you feel very comfortable in weather like this. Why do you feel so comfortable?

JAMES HAHN: Yeah, I grew up in this stuff. This is kind of the reason why I left California is because of weather like this. It seemed like the year that I left, it was raining 100 days out of the year and so I would practice in this every day. So I feel comfortable. It kind of brings me back to the good old days when I was young and carefree and just wanted to go out and play golf.

Q. You only made one bogey over two rounds. In normal conditions on this golf course that's very good. How impressive to you is that?

JAMES HAHN: I've done it before. This is definitely a golf course where you expect to make a couple bogeys during the round. I mean, it's tough. Yesterday I shot 4 under with one bogey and today I shot 2 under with no bogeys. I'd much rather prefer the 4 under with a bogey, but overall to play 36 holes really solid, not making any bogeys, I'm very proud of that.
