

LUKE LIST (-6)

Q. Luke, how difficult were those conditions out there today?

LUKE LIST: Yeah, fortunately, the wind wasn't blowing. That would have been really an extra element. But anytime it's raining constantly like that for an extended period, was challenging to stay dry and just stay patient. It's tough to get around this golf course anyway, but add that element of cold and rain, it was challenging out there.

Q. That being said, how good was that round today?

LUKE LIST: Yeah, 4 under on this golf course, I'll take it. Sunshine or no wind, doesn't matter any conditions, 4 under on this golf course is a good score. So to do it today was just, like I said, a testament to be able to keep my emotions in check and made some nice swings out there.

Q. Considering no wind and considering that you're already through 36 holes, do you feel like you got the better end of the draw?

LUKE LIST: I have no idea. If it rains continuously this afternoon, it will probably be the same, I guess. Yesterday afternoon was pretty easy and I was a little disappointed I didn't get a few more birdies yesterday afternoon early on. I was able to finish well, which gave me some momentum into today. But we play all year long, the draws usually equal out over time. I'm happy where I'm at right now.

Q. Ball's not going as far today? Hitting more long irons in?

LUKE LIST: No question. The last 6, 7, 8 were playing really long, just that cool air and just a touch of wind but really not that much. The damp conditions make the ball go 10 yards shorter.

Q. Is that where kind of like maybe your length can be a little bit of a factor because the ball's not going as far?

LUKE LIST: Yeah, I think so. I was really just trying to hit kind of a "get it in the fairway" swing with the driver. I wasn't really swinging 100 percent confidence with the driver, but I was able to hit my fade out there and keep that in front of me. But yeah, hopefully kind of find a rhythm with the driver over the weekend and give myself some short irons into the holes.
