

KEEGAN BRADLEY (-8)

Q. Keegan, can you kind of describe the mental grind it was out there?

KEEGAN BRADLEY: Yeah, what I was just saying to Rex, when the conditions get like this, I find a sense of calm just because I'm sort of worried about other things, keeping my clubs dry and my bag dry. Sort of keeps me in the present. I did that today and I just had a great time with my caddie Scotty, we just -- we're a good team and we did a lot of good things today.

Q. What's been the components that have given you these top-10 finishes recently and getting you where you are now at this point in the tournament?

KEEGAN BRADLEY: I mean, today and yesterday were just really good ball-striking and really good putting. It's rare that we match those up and I've matched that up these last two days. If I can just keep that going a little bit, I'll like my chances.

Q. You had that great round at THE PLAYERS Championship in really, really tough wind, really was two shots better than the score indicated there. Now you're playing so well today, 65 yesterday. Do you find that as your career goes on, you start looking more forward to bad weather?

KEEGAN BRADLEY: I wouldn't say more forward, but especially my coach, Darren May, and my caddie, Scotty, are in my ear that these sort of conditions are good for me. When you look at the weather, the extended weather, as a player you get sort of stressed when you see this even though everyone's playing in it, it's silly. But they were sort of in my ear saying this is what you want, you want it to be windy and tough. I'm starting to believe them. This week has been really a tough week and I've held my own out here.

KEEGAN BRADLEY: Yeah, I mean, it's been a long time since I've lived here, but I played in a lot worse than this. I know how to play in it, I sort of know the routine of kind of bad weather. It helps to have a good caddie and I've got a good caddie. It can sort of be a shot here or there when you've got a good caddie in these conditions and I got that.

Q. How much is playing your way into the top-60 in the world and to the U.S. Open and Beantown, is that on your mind?

KEEGAN BRADLEY: I'm trying not to think about it, but you reminded me. It's on my mind. I know what's at stake. A lot of good things can come with a good round tomorrow.
