It motivates me to make more birdies to catch up. Hopefully, I don't know what I'm going to end up having, if it's a lead or if it's tied, you want to stretch that lead. I don't know, I haven't played from in front all that often, but it's nice to know where you are and keep going, make more distance.

Q. If you see somebody's name above you, a certain in-state guy, does that light a little extra fire?

JERRY KELLY: We love going back and forth. I mean, there's no question it fuels us both. It couldn't be a better friendly rivalry than what we have. It's awesome, I wouldn't change a thing except I'd like to win more.

Q. What's it like having your wife back out here with you? It's got to mean a ton.

JERRY KELLY: It's everything. I mean, it's the whole reason I won at Des Moines, six months, it was so great. That just brings life into perspective so golf can be a little easier, and it really has been easier. Eased up on myself just because we're having so much fun when we come out that we've got to realize that's what life's about. The work can obviously pile on you, especially in this sport, in any job I would say, but yeah, we're hard on ourselves out here but to have a partner like Carol, we're just loving it.

Q. Jerry, how about that shot on 18, the approach. It was a pretty nifty little --

JERRY KELLY: That was nifty, thanks, Bret. That was nifty, I liked that one. it came close to going in going by the hole, didn't it? I enjoyed it. I told my caddie I wasn't going to complain about having a straight downhill putt because I was pretty happy to be having a putt. I thought the putt was going to be really fast, it has been in the past. Just put the brakes on, but hit a good second putt. Good solid par.

Q. I know Strick gave you a putting tip somewhat recently. Have you held onto that? How long do you hold onto putting thoughts to help yourself?

JERRY KELLY: I have 1,000 percent held onto that and that is everything that I'm doing and it is everything, the reason that my putting is working right now. Yeah, he gave me a gift, there's no question about it. That's definitely Steve, you know. He's going to go out of his way, but we all are. We'll do that for each other. It's a good friendship out here.
