Yeah, I'm just trying to work through a couple more things that I'm working on on the range. It's getting better, yesterday in the pro-am it was better. It's just not quite getting into tournament golf yet.

I three-putted from three feet on 15, which is a killer. One ball out of bounds. I hung in there for a 1 over to at least give myself a chance to play tomorrow, but still frustrating.

Q. And, Webb, you mentioned how this place kind of gets your juices flowing. A little disappointing that you couldn't maybe turn it on, because it can't be automatic either?

WEBB SIMPSON: Yeah, the pins were tough today, the rough is up this year, but it was still gettable, somebody shot 9 under. Yeah, very frustrating. But I can't get too frustrated yet, I've got to go have a good practice session, get back at it tomorrow.

Q. And do you look at tomorrow any differently than if you would have shot 65?

WEBB SIMPSON: Not really. I mean, this golf course, if you start trying to be too aggressive, it will get you really fast. Just the old adage, one shot at a time.
