BRIAN HARMAN (-17)



Q. Animated after the last approach shot. Can you just talk us through, what did you have?

BRIAN HARMAN: I thought I pulled it off. I got a 7-iron, downhill slope, 177, wind helping and I thought I had done it perfect. It just hit right into that hill and I got no -- I got no release. I thought off the downhill I could get it.

But, you know, I had a nice day. I just, there was a couple I left out there, but sometimes you just get beat.

Q. When you look at, and I looked up, go to the approach on 18 and the putt on 17, seems like there's a thousand ways you could break down your round. What's the one thing that stands out to you today that could have gone the other way?

BRIAN HARMAN: I got really cold on that front nine, I was not feeling great. My body wasn't moving very good. Really proud of the way that I hung in there. Really wish I could have made the putt on 11, that was a big one. Got in there close, I felt I could have gotten a little more momentum. Had a good look on 13, hit a perfect shot on 14 that I thought was up there naked and it's 25 feet short. When it gets cold like that, it's hard to get the ball all the way to the hole. But I was proud of the way I hung in there, it's a good week. I wanted to win this one real bad.

Q. Going kind of forward, what will you remember? Is it going to be disappointment or happy that you put yourself in contention in this event?

BRIAN HARMAN: Well, I'm always happy to get in contention. My record's around here been OK. Not fantastic, it's been all right. I don't know how much anybody knows, but this was the first RSM that I had where Jack Lumpkin that watched me warm up. So for me it was a little tough out there on the back nine, but felt like he was with me a couple times, it's pretty cool.

Q. Did you think about him?

BRIAN HARMAN: Yeah, I think about him all the time, man. It's hard not to around here.
