ROUND 1 INTERVIEW February 9, 2023

DAVID KOCHER (-8)



Q. David, opening with an 8 under the first round. Kind of walk me through your day and what was going right.

DAVID KOCHER: Yeah, I hit a lot of really good shots, hit a lot of really good chips. Honestly, I played the shorter course today, so you're driving it right up next to the greens. Had some short-sided chips, hit a few tight and tapped in a few times. Just an overall really good day. Changed putters yesterday, so rolled it a lot better today than I did last week and earlier this week.

Q. What did you change to?

DAVID KOCHER: Changed to a different Odyssey putter. It's a different style mallet and everything. A little bit more toe hang so I can release the ball, or release the putter a little bit better.

Q. A lot of great shots out there. If you had to pick like one hole, kind of walk us through your favorite, what was a good shot that you had today?

DAVID KOCHER: Well, I hit it over the green on 4, which is in a terrible spot, and kind of bumped it into the hill and popped straight up and rolled in a seven-footer. But other than that, just a lot of really quality shots, lot of really good chips.

Q. All right. Other course tomorrow, what's the game plan for attacking that course?

DAVID KOCHER: Just putt really well again. Speed control's a big thing out here, the greens are really fast. Just try to hopefully hit a lot of greens and have a lot of good looks at birdie. Putting really well right now and hitting the ball really nicely, so hopefully I can continue that.

Q. Is there one course that you feel like you like better or fits you better or are they both kind of similar for you?

DAVID KOCHER: The short course is definitely a lot easier in my opinion just because you're right around the green a lot of times, but the long course is a great course as well. You have to hit a lot of really good shots on both courses, so I'm just looking forward to it tomorrow.



Q. Did you know coming out today like this is the easier course, I kind of need to go and attack it and do what I can to get a low score starting off?

DAVID KOCHER: There wasn't really much attack, I guess. I just tried to leave it in the right spots around the greens and everything, kind of give myself a lot of easier chips. So it wasn't really an attack mode for me, just tried to hit a lot of really good quality golf shots and luckily a few putts went in.

Q. Fourth event of the season so far in 2023, how would you assess your game?

DAVID KOCHER: I played very poorly the first two events and then the third event I played really solid, finished I think 14th. Kind of trending into this week and hopefully we can keep it rolling.

Q. Was there any difference for you? Was it that putter or what was it that kind of the big difference?

DAVID KOCHER: No, just kind of a different game plan, just I really like Panama and I really like this week. So yeah, I like these two courses a little -- they suit my game a little bit better than Exuma and Abaco.

Q. What is it that suits your game here?

DAVID KOCHER: Just a little tighter tee shots. I guess Exuma you have a lot of really tight tee shots, but fair. You know, I think the harder courses suit me a little bit better. With it being firm and at altitude this week, it's its own challenge so I like that.

Q. Yeah, being at altitude, is there any changes that you made to your bag, things you're not going to touch, that you brought in or anything like that?

DAVID KOCHER: Not really, I kind of kept it all the same. I experimented with changing a few things earlier in the week, but they didn't go too well, so I'm going to keep it all the same the rest of the week.
