

CARSON YOUNG (-9)

Q. Just a few comments about the round today?

CARSON YOUNG: Yeah, I feel like I played solid today. I drove it pretty well and I made a lot of putts, especially early. I feel like that's been the thing for me for this whole season. I haven't really putted all that well, but I've hit it decent enough to score well. So it was nice to finally make some putts today, especially early to get 4 or 5 under through four or five holes was nice, especially in this wind. Couldn't ask for a better round today so I'm pleased with that.

Q. Have you ever made three eagles in a round before?

CARSON YOUNG: Not that I remember. I'm not sure. We can call this a first, I don't know.

Q. Well, for the second week in a row you're atop the leaderboard after 18 holes. What did you learn from last week and coming into this week, could you have felt a round like this coming on?

CARSON YOUNG: I could actually. I was -- after last week I had a lot of positives from that week, especially having the lead after the first round and a little bit through the second round. Then I saw some good strides with my putting and my ball-striking, so it was cool to get in that scenario to where I was in the lead and in contention for a little bit.

Yeah, I felt good coming into this week and just knew I had to stay patient out there, it's very windy out there, and just play good golf, and worked out great for me today.

Q. Can you give me your best shot of the day?

CARSON YOUNG: Yes. On 15 I had about 255 par 5 straight into the wind, trees in front of me. I could have played a cut out to the left and tried to cut it on the green, but the wind was so strong I decided to just hit like this high draw 3-wood over the trees and I flushed it to about, I don't know, eight or nine feet and made that for my third eagle. That was a pretty special shot, for sure.

Q. And last question for you, this is all still kind of new to you out here on the PGA TOUR. Do you feel like you're getting acclimated, fitting in well? Obviously you're putting up some really good scores. Are you kind of getting the lay of the land so to speak?

CARSON YOUNG: Yeah, I'm learning every week, I'm getting more comfortable out here.

It's nice, I've actually played here a couple years ago, it was my first PGA TOUR event, so at least I've seen this course whereas the West Coast Swing it was a bunch of courses that I've never seen and a bunch of practice rounds. It was nice to be on the east coast again with the bermudagrass, which is what I'm used to. Having to play one course is nice. Yeah, just happy about the day.
