CLÉMENT SORDET (-5)



Q. Clément, nice start to the tournament here at the Barbasol. Just talk about your round a little bit. What did you do well today?

CLÉMENT SORDET: Yeah, it was great, I played really well. I was struggling the past few weeks off the tee and I managed to keep it on the fairway this week. Yeah, I had some really close shots on the par 5s, managed to make three eagles so that helps the scorecard. I played really well, so yeah, very pleased with today.

Q. You said that two eagles, you made the second one and immediately after a double bogey. What was the situation there?

CLÉMENT SORDET: Yeah, it was a tough double bogey. I hit a bad shot in the trees, got really unlucky. I was sitting next to a root so I had to go backwards. Yeah, managed to make double, but just made eagle so I told myself, you know what, the last two holes it's even par, there's plenty of holes left. Yeah, I kept going.

Q. You just told me this is your first trip to Kentucky. What have you gotten to do away from the golf course if anything?

CLÉMENT SORDET: Yeah, I haven't done much since I'm here, to be honest, other than golf. Got here Monday night. It's great to be back in the U.S., I haven't been back playing golf tournaments since I left Texas Tech in 2015, so it's great to be back.

Q. Speaking of Texas Tech, have you followed Ludvig Aberg's career rise?

CLÉMENT SORDET: Yeah, he's doing well, he's doing really good. I don't know him personally, I haven't met him, but he seems to be a great player and a great guy, so very happy for him.

Q. Finally, talk about this golf course. Does it fit your eye? What have you seen that you like about it?
