

ROUND 4 PRESS CONFERENCE
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VINCENT NORRMAN (-22, won 1st playoff hole)

JOHN BUSH: We would like to welcome the 2023 Barbasol Championship winner, Vincent Norrman.

Vincent, what a day that was for you, a 66 including that 30 on the front nine and then winning in the playoff. Congratulations on winning for the first time on the PGA TOUR. If we can get some comments.

VINCENT NORRMAN: Thank you very much.

Yeah, I mean, it's been a crazy week and obviously today, the first nine was almost flawless. Yeah, how I finished the front nine I'm really proud of, then hung in there on the back. I'm happy to be sitting here.

JOHN BUSH: Take us through the playoff hole as well against Nathan.

VINCENT NORRMAN: Yeah, I mean, he flared his a little bit right. We saw it was up in the rough, so just hit a bad shot in regulation there and we knew what to do. I hit a really good tee shot I thought. I had a pretty tough lie, downhill left to right usually comes out left on me and that kind of flared right. That was a pretty tricky chip as well and I just put a good strike on it and hit it up there close.

JOHN BUSH: You move up to No. 61 in the FedExCup standings, and with the top 70 advancing to the Playoffs this year, just talk a little bit about how important that is to you as we're in the home stretch of the season.

VINCENT NORRMAN: Yeah, it's obviously very important. I didn't know that myself, but it's hard to think about now and how I just want to celebrate and we can reflect on all that stuff tomorrow.

JOHN BUSH: Just talk a little bit about how you managed your nerves on the back nine today.

VINCENT NORRMAN: I mean, it's tough, but my caddie was really good in keeping me in the moment. He was always giving me good words of encouragement and that kind of helped me a lot. We talked a lot about stuff other than golf and it kept me calm.

JOHN BUSH: Is this something that you've dreamed of, to win on the PGA TOUR?

VINCENT NORRMAN: Yeah, that's where I started back home in Sweden, to be on the



putting green and dreaming of having the putt to win a PGA TOUR event. Now I'm here at 25 and it's amazing.

JOHN BUSH: And then we'll get you to take us through the last hole of regulation there, especially that putt that went all the way around and then finally in.

VINCENT NORRMAN: Yeah, it was a poor tee shot, I just pulled it left. Really, really rough lie. Didn't really know what was going to happen with the water right. If it goes right, you're kind of screwed. Took it a little more left and it came out very dead and left, that shot. I thought I hit a really good chip or third shot from there. Then same with the chip, I just misjudged it a little bit, came out hot and had a good read on the putt, it kind of broke a little extra. I'm happy it went in.

JOHN BUSH: And what is your schedule now going forward through the rest of the regular season?

VINCENT NORRMAN: I have actually no idea. I guess we'll sit down and figure it out tomorrow.

JOHN BUSH: How will you celebrate tonight?

VINCENT NORRMAN: My girlfriend just surprised me after the 72nd hole and we're going to -- her brother's here as well, I roomed with him all week. Going to bring them out, take my caddie out for a nice dinner and yeah, that's it for now.

JOHN BUSH: All right. Do we have any questions? Anything for Vincent? All right. That's going to wrap up the English portion of our press conference. Give us just a second and we'll start Swedish.
