Q. Ludvig, good playing. You made the turn in 1 over today and turned it around with a 30 on your second nine. Can you just walk us through the round today?

LUDVIG ABERG: Yeah, absolutely. I felt like it wasn't easy, but I did feel like the front nine, my -- I guess the back nine, my first nine was a little bit more difficult. We had a lot of rain actually, which made it pretty difficult, ball wasn't flying as far. But I just told myself to keep playing and knowing that you'll get some opportunities with some wedges in par 5s. Luckily I was able to take care of it on the back nine and looking forward to the next couple days.

Q. Impressions of the golf course? Obviously making your first start here, but just a couple comments on the course?

LUDVIG ABERG: It's good. It's not the easiest of courses. You've got to keep the ball in the fairway. The rough is up quite a bit so you can get some pretty nasty lies in the rough. If you're not in the fairway, it gets pretty difficult. But it's really true, it's really fair. If you play well, hit the shots, you're probably going to score pretty well. But you also need to hit shots, which is what I like.

Q. And lastly, just your, you know, got a few tournaments under your belt now since joining as a member. How would you describe your comfort level playing out here on Tour now?

LUDVIG ABERG: Yeah, you know, it's been so much fun ever since I made my first start at the Canadian a couple of weeks ago. I've enjoyed every minute. I've tried to embrace it and being OK with maybe being a little bit tired every now and then because played a lot of golf. But I'm super fortunate to be able to play a lot of golf and hopefully I'll be able to play some good golf in the future as well.
