Q. Beau, overall a solid fourth round today, and great performance this week at ZOZO. Can you just kind of summarize how you feel about this week?

BEAU HOSSLER: Yeah. I mean, a little fresh right now obviously. Would have had to play, as it turns out, really, really well today to win. And that's what champions do, right? Collin's a proven champion on the biggest stages, so kudos to him.

Tons of positives this week. A little exhausted at the moment having just gotten off the course and kind of grinded. Didn't have my A stuff today, but it was tough today. There was a lot of tricky pins and the wind was doing some funky stuff. Unfortunately, I couldn't get really any putts to go in, but like I said, I would have had to shoot 5 under to get in a playoff today? Yeah, that's an excellent round for me.

Q. I know it's frustrating, you're knocking on the door of your first win. What did this do for your confidence moving forward?

BEAU HOSSLER: I would say this is just a continuation of -- probably the last three months for me has been a significant trend in the right direction. I'm tired of talking about what I'm capable of doing, it's about time I just do it. You know, me and my team know what I'm capable of and I just hope to do it.

Like you said, a really, really good step forward this week, probably my highest finish in quite a while. To put four solid rounds together and keep it together on a day that could have gotten away from me a little bit today was a plus.

Q. Are weeks like this what keep you motivated? You've played a lot of golf this year, I'm sure you're tired. Is this what keeps you going, knocking on the door?

BEAU HOSSLER: You put a lot of hours and time and energy, and people around you dedicate themselves to helping you, and significant others and parents and family. There's a lot that goes into it.

For me, you play for the opportunity to win championships. Everybody out here does just fine financially, but having putts that mean something to career landmarks is what you play for.

Like I said, I was really glad to have that opportunity today. Collin ran away with it, played incredible.

But like you said, to get that opportunity is a huge steppingstone in the right direction because I haven't been there in so long until the last probably, like I said, three months have been really outstanding as far as progress to where I want to be. I know if I keep knocking on the door that I'll get it done here soon.

As far as my golf game, it's top to bottom as sharp as it's been in a long time, so that's really exciting.

Q. This week locked you up for the next 10, gets you into that 51 to 60 position, so are you going to go to Mexico next week, and what are you looking forward to next season knowing you'll get signature events in '24?

BEAU HOSSLER: Yeah, I will be at Cabo. I'm having a friend of mine caddie for me there, so that will be a really fun experience. We've had that planned for quite a while, so that will be really fun.

And then after that I'll probably shut it down. As you mentioned, it's been a hectic year. Really strenuous schedule, particularly with the top-50 being so important this year, I wanted to give myself the best chance to do that. Fell a little bit short, but I guess a little bit of icing on the cake here to play so far pretty darn well in the fall and secure I guess now, according to you, a couple starts to start the year. That's kind of what we're playing for.

Obviously it's a big difference points wise in those tournaments. Frankly, my whole thing, and I've said this from top to bottom, you want the opportunity to compete against the best players in the world and that's where they'll be. So I hope to earn my way into all of them and compete and hopefully win some golf tournaments.
