Q. All right. So obviously Kevin wanted me to ask you some questions. He mentioned that you have a quote about there should be a book of all the guys who made by one or missed by one, and then you've kind of lived that across the last few years. He's messaging me, one second. So kind of with that, what does that mean to you to have a year where you won't be on the bubble, that you've kind of gotten to this point in the season?

JUSTIN LOWER: I don't know, it means a lot. I had a good fall last year which kind of set me up for this, I guess. And I haven't played -- I think I haven't played great this season at all, but I've had a lot of adjusting to deal with. I mean, I have a 10-month-old daughter who's the love of my life now, so I'm not the most important one out here anymore.

Yeah, it's just, it's cool, but I still want to -- I'd much rather go into RSM at like 61 knowing like a good week would get me into the top 60.

Q. So could you walk us through maybe the internal emotions that you had this week or leading up to this week, either relief or pride of knowing that you have your Tour card for next year?

JUSTIN LOWER: I thought about it a little bit. I did the math, I think I had a 75-point lead over the 125 spot, and I haven't looked at projections at all this week. I knew I was playing well, it was just a matter of putting it together. I still haven't put four days together, I feel like that's been kind of the story of my fall. Yeah, I mean, it's nice to just kind of relax a little bit, but it's hard for me to relax out here.
