Q. How important were those bookend two points, starting with two points, finishing with two points?

JERRY KELLY: Yeah, that was big just getting that first putt to drop for birdie and getting those going. Then about a 12-, 14-footer for par on the next hole. I was trying to pull it into a little stroke play. OK, keep it under par, keep it under par, keep going, and birdied three out of those first four, I think. Got it rolling a little bit and when the swing got loose once the wind starting kicking up and made some great par saves. It's what you've got to do on these greens, they're tough. You get a lot of double breakers, you've just got to trust it and hit solid putts.

Q. How much different does this golf course play when there's no wind compared to now like 15 miles an hour and it looks even stronger this afternoon?

JERRY KELLY: I mean, we can kind of place our ball in the general area when the wind's not blowing where we're going to have nice putts at it. You're going to find guys in a lot of strange spots because of this wind this afternoon. It's going to be tough up-and-downs. It's going to be fun to watch.

Q. He's saying that because it might not be fun to play out there, too.

JERRY KELLY: Exactly.

Q. What's going to be the most important thing then this afternoon knowing as volatile as the scoring's going to be?

JERRY KELLY: Really, fairway first, then getting the ball up and down, because you're probably going to miss some greens.

Q. OK, that's the important thing. Go get something to eat. Would you rather like we did on Thursday and Friday just keep going, let's just turn and go, or do you like having a little break right now?

JERRY KELLY: Usually depends on how you played. I'd like to keep going.

Q. Guy with three birdies wants to keep going. Sorry, go get a sandwich. Play well this afternoon.
