HARRISON ENDYCOTT

Q. Take us through how the week has been for you so far.

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: It's been really solid this week. Just really been working hard on limiting mistakes. Just done a really good job of that today. I think I didn't really make a mistake today on a tough day. 18 was very easy to make a mistake this afternoon, and it was nice to make a pretty clutch par on the last.

I feel really free. Putter feels great. I'm just kind of in a good head space this week. It's a weird one just because of Q-school and how it's a different format, just slightly different opportunities for so many different guys.

Coming into this week for me was a little bit of a freer week, and also being able to trust what I was working on over the last few weeks at home, and it's a good week to come in and try that.

I'm playing really, really good golf, really happy where I'm hitting the shots to, where I'm making putts from. I know different golf course tomorrow, but I definitely feel like I'm going to play well tomorrow.

Q. Obviously throughout the fall you were kind of chasing status. Does this feel like an extension of that? Are you comfortable in this space?

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: Yeah, the fall is a different thing because it's just a little bit more consistent. You've got to play well consistently, where here it's a little -- like you kind of know what you've got to do and what you don't have to do. Like I know sixth -- I'm in the same position as finishing sixth, and we try to make the best of our starts next year.

It feels like a very free -- I've got a good excuse to be very free over this week, and especially into tomorrow to go play. With the fall, you try to get in contention. We were in a tie for the lead if not one back or something going into the weekend in the Sanderson. You feel that a little bit. It's a different feeling there.

Yeah, I'm really looking forward to tomorrow. Hopefully we don't get too smashed tonight with the weather and we actually get out and get to play golf tomorrow.

Q. You got a taste of the PGA TOUR last season. What did you learn about yourself out there?



HARRISON ENDYCOTT: Oh, definitely strategy. That's what I've been really working hard on. We did a really good debrief on statistics. Too many short-sided misses, just too greedy. It's a slightly different game from Korn Ferry to PGA TOUR. Korn Ferry you have a little bit more aggressive, low scoring, where PGA TOUR it's similar to what we're playing this week, hitting lots of fat spots of greens and being okay with 25, 30 feet. We've had to be a little bit more disciplined with that.

I'm definitely going to have to continue to keep working on that, especially into next year's season. Weeks like Honda, PLAYERS, Wells Fargo, weeks where it's just -- it really does penalize being short-sided.

Yeah, it's being able to trust that process into next year and just keep working hard on it. This was, again, a great week for me to be able to really kind of learn how to trust that.

Q. Is it an advantage tomorrow for you knowing that you can count on that 126 to 150 category next year on the PGA TOUR?

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: Yeah, absolutely, because I will be playing next year. There's other guys -- at the same time, I want to be able to pick a schedule, so still, it's not like I'm going to go play tomorrow like it doesn't mean anything. I've got a two-shot lead in a regular golf tournament, and trying to close it out. There's a lot of good players this week. I've still got to go and play well. I can't go and shoot nothing and expect to win.

It's one of those ones where I'm still trying to mentally feel like this is a Sunday of a PGA TOUR event. It's what you work for. It still does mean something. I just want to go do my best tomorrow and see what happens.

Q. Did you have a feeling before this week started that it could be a very similar week to what's played out so far?

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: Yeah, definitely. Just one, the style of golf course -- especially when I saw this golf course for the first time, I know they played THE PLAYERS here back in the '70s and '80s, I think, maybe a little bit earlier, but this type of golf here, it's all about missing in the right spots, avoiding mistakes, and knowing that -- trying to go in with a game plan to trust that. I felt if I do a good job of that then capitalize when I can, I knew I really did believe I could be atop the leaderboard somewhere along the week. Obviously you've still got to go and play well against a lot of really, really good players to be in a position like that, but I knew if I did a good job of that, I could have a chance.

Yeah, I'm really excited for tomorrow. Three weeks off is too much for a touring pro, so I was getting pretty hungry to play this week, last week at home.

Q. How do you mentally prepare for the conditions and kind of the unknown of how tomorrow -- the weather, when you start, how things are going to go? How do you mentally approach that?

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: I mean, you've just got to kind of deal with what it is. I think an hour earlier, like today on 18, was a significantly easier hole than what we played in,



and that's just how it is. I mean, it's the weather. We're going to do the best we can to deal with what we've got. Tomorrow it's going to be tough for everyone, so I'm just going to try to do the best I can.

I feel very free with my golf right now, so if I can just free it up tomorrow, hit my shots, I'll be fine.

Q. I know Aussies love their coffee. Are you any different?

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: Yeah, absolutely. Sago has been my spot this week. It was the same THE PLAYERS week, too. Sago is my spot here. We've been there every day this week. They do a good donut there, too. It's pretty good.

The good thing about being here long enough now, we know where our little spots are to go each destination. You guys are pretty lucky you have a good coffee shop not far from us.

Q. That might be the key to your second season on the PGA TOUR.

HARRISON ENDYCOTT: Yeah, I might have to tone it down. I'm normally a cortado and a flat white, and I get a little shaky after the cortado, so I might have to just stick to one in the morning to keep the putter a little steadier.
