LUDVIG ÅBERG (-16)

Q. How would you kind of assess that round today?

LUDVIG ÅBERG: It was good. It was quite stress free, to be honest. I didn't miss that many greens. Felt like we spoke about when to be aggressive, when not to be aggressive and I think we did a great job of that. There was a lot of pins that kind of back in the soft greens back corner and they're quite tricky to get to, but I felt like we were aggressive when we needed to.

Didn't quite catch Wyndham coming down the last couple holes, but felt like overall it was a good day.

Q. When you're playing as far back as you were from Wyndham and you see a score that he was putting up, is it hard to kind of stick to that plan of not trying to be more aggressive than you want to be?

LUDVIG ÅBERG: It's a little bit different, but we were also beforehand OK with that. I think my biggest concern was just not rain too much so I actually had a chance to make a couple of birdies coming in. But no, obviously felt like I was playing pretty well and gave it a shot. Ended up one shot sort short, but we'll see.

Q. What do you feel like you did the best today?

LUDVIG ÅBERG: I think just my patience, to be honest. I didn't try to force anything, I didn't try to hit shots that I didn't feel like I could pull off. I felt like we did that great today and yesterday. And hopefully what the weather looks like, I think that's going to be key as well for the last round. So we'll see how that plays out, but hopefully we'll play some good golf again.

Q. You talked about patience. A lot of different scenarios, the weather just looks terrible tomorrow, could play tomorrow, could not play, might go to Monday. How do you kind of prepare your mind for what could be the next couple days?

LUDVIG ÅBERG: I think for me, even though the weather looks pretty bad tomorrow, I think you've got to be prepared to play, be prepared to play a rough round of golf where the weather is going to be windy and raining and then just be OK with that. Then whatever happens, happens. We'll see what happens, but I'll be ready to play tomorrow.

Q. Do you feel like -- especially coming from Sweden and you played obviously in west Texas in the cold and a lot of wind, do you feel you're kind of a good mudder, bad weather golfer?



LUDVIG ÅBERG: I played a lot of golf in bad weather so maybe that's why. Yeah, maybe a little bit from where I grew up and how I played for a long time. You know, the PGA TOUR is very nice in terms of the weather a lot, so I've kind of been a little bit spoiled over the last year and a half, something like that.
