ERNIE ELS (-21)

ERNIE ELS: Yeah, yeah, I mean, I've been close before. I really felt the work we put in, myself and my caddie, Rich, put a lot of work in the last couple weeks. I just felt more comfortable with my whole game. When you feel comfortable, you can enjoy the pressure, you can enjoy the battle, so that's kind of how I felt today.

ERNIE ELS: I think it's brilliant. Obviously I'm going to say that. It was a bit narrow for me on a couple of holes back in the day, but I think they opened up No. 8 and No. 10 and some other holes. I think it's very playable even for the members.



I drove it well today, the whole week, and I putted well. So the course, I mean, taking the course back to original design, I think that's what it's all about.
