MIN WOO LEE: No. Again, we're kind of used to it. I feel like there's been a lot of delays over the last few months. Kind of just learn from it. I don't really do much before the round, just kept it pretty simple.

Q. Just thoughts on maybe how the course maybe changed in terms of the way it played with all the rain this morning?

MIN WOO LEE: Yeah, the course, there's no run, the ball just plugs a few meters or a feet from where you did land it. I guess it played a little longer. The biggest factor was the wind. I mean, we've been playing in pretty calm conditions the last two days and today was like a hurricane, felt like a hurricane. It was good to play a variety of shots when you needed to and yeah, I guess it's -- it was fun.

Q. In contention going into tomorrow, what's the thing you're looking forward to the most?

MIN WOO LEE: Again, just putting myself in that position and hopefully I can make a few more birdies. It's a course where you can go low, so yeah, just go out there and try to hit it



and putt as good as I can.
