Q. Good round, Patton. You mentioned you had a little lull. You've played really well on the back nine, a lot of birdies. What is it about this course? It seems like you finished runner-up here and you almost seem like you have a type. You won at Mayakoba, you won at Sony. These are courses that are somewhat similar, no?

PATTON KIZZIRE: Yeah, this is very similar to Sony. This course has a little more undulation on the greens. The greens were fantastic. The maintenance crew has done a fantastic job, the agronomy team has done a fantastic job. They're rolling really nice. I'm seeing the greens well and putting it on the line, it's holding. This is a golf course I really enjoy playing and I'm looking forward to tomorrow.

Q. You've talked a little bit about having a new mental coach. What about the actual like swing coach and that kind of thing, has that changed as well or is that still the same?

PATTON KIZZIRE: No, I've had the same swing coach for, gosh, a handful of years. He and I have done some great work. JP has been there when I needed him and I'm not always an easy student, so he's learned more about me and I've learned more about myself and we're getting into some good stuff. Swing feels good. I've been a little bit more focused on the mental game because I think that allows my swing to work, so that's been a good combo.

Q. JP is?

PATTON KIZZIRE: His name's Justin Parsons.

Q. That's right. Finally, when you went through that stretch early this season, I think you had six straight cuts that you missed, is there something in the game, something, maybe the stats or something that was glaringly wrong or were we just missing these things by one or two shots?

PATTON KIZZIRE: I think what was wrong, you couldn't see it in the stats. I think the consistency comes from a solid mental foundation and allowing yourself to compete. So I've been working on that and that's been a huge boost for me.
