PAUL BROADHURST (-14)



Q. It's just not easy to win golf tournaments, is it? How did you get it through to the finish time?

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PAUL BROADHURST: With difficulty, I have to say. I've never been in that position before, having a five-shot lead. I just went out and tried to play solid, and I felt like I did for nine holes. You know, I was reasonably comfortable. just a couple of poor shots to the right on 12 and 13 and then you start thinking a little bit.

Just a bit unlucky on 15. I was on an upslope and I was just worried I would turn it to the left and I sort of held it off too much and it popped in the wind and cost me a silly bogey from middle of the fairway.

I played 16 pretty good. 17, I knew I (indiscernible) hold the green because I played it too low, I just (indiscernible) like Vijay does up in the clouds. I knew that was always going to be a problem, but got up and down, that gave me a bit of breathing space.

Q. How big was that putt on 17?

PAUL BROADHURST: Oh, it's massive. Bogey at the last. It's a lot easier than making par at the last. I relaxed a little bit over the third shot and played a nice one. I didn't want to shoot over par and win, I don't like -- you know, my kids would be giving me (indiscernible) if I shoot over par. I was pleased to hole that last one.

Q. Just show them the trophy.

PAUL BROADHURST: Absolutely. They'll -- I don't know what time it is back home, but they're still watching the scores.

Q. You've had a great career, you've played really difficult golf courses very well, here, Carnoustie, you've won all over. Why does your game fit so well around Pebble Beach?

PAUL BROADHURST: I don't know. I enjoy playing Pebble Beach, I always have since I came out here in my first year in 2016. Spyglass is the one that I (indiscernible), I couldn't see 6 under and went out and shot it, I was absolutely amazed. I can sort of see a score around Pebble when you're playing really well, but I can also see level par. It's not that easy. Hit it in the wrong places and it's tough.



Yesterday I just hit it really well, hit it close and made some putts. Today it was a different story, was sort of hanging on. Hit the greens, 30 feet, two putts, get out of there and not try and make too many silly errors, that was the difference.
