WOODY AUSTIN (-4)

Q. What a charge that must be to come down the stretch like that, and what a great putt at 18 to finish your round.

WOODY AUSTIN: I don't know about charge, I just wanted it to be over.

I played really good. I mean, I hit 16 greens today. That was the only one-putt. I had 38 putts today. I was getting beat by Jerry by 10 shots and he wasn't playing that much better than I was. It's not -- it's not fun. It's not fun to -- I mean, I can't even make it from two feet. It's just not fun.

Q. Well, you're in at this point, so that has to give you some solace.

WOODY AUSTIN: That's what I tried to do coming in this week. To have to hit it that good just to finish in the top-20, that's ridiculous. I'm glad that I get to at least play one more tournament. I can't say how well I hit it. I hit it so close to the hole. Today I didn't have tap-ins, so I had to make four- and five-footers and I just couldn't make 'em. It's just depressing.

Q. How would you evaluate your year and how you got here at this point where we're standing?

WOODY AUSTIN: Depressing. Like I said, I mean, this is the second year in a row I averaged over a three-putt a tournament. I just finished top-20 and I three-putted seven times this week. You tell me.
