MAX GREYSERMAN (-14)



Q. Max, 64 today, how satisfying was that?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, it was a good round from the start, pretty straightforward. Was able to hit a lot of greens. Got off to an OK start and just waited for the putts to drop and then they started dropping. Been putting well all week. Feel like I'm a pretty good putter, so just got to stay patient and when the putts fall, they fall, add 'em up at the end.

Q. A couple birdies coming down the last few holes. How important was it to get a little bit closer to the lead?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, I'm not necessarily a leaderboard watcher, but if the board's there I'll maybe take a peek. I saw where everyone is. You just want to stay within striking distance going into the final round and that's where I'm at. Obviously we would like to be in the lead, but I'm in a good spot to have a chance tomorrow.

Q. You had a couple of nice round finishes recently. What sort of experiences can you take from those events that may help you tomorrow?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, I mean, probably that the tournament's not over until the last putt goes in, job's not finished until every shot's done. So going to go out there and put full effort into every shot like I always do and hopefully it goes my way.

Q. How exciting is it to have an opportunity to win that first one? Everyone's trying to do that, right?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, it's a lot of fun, it's what we practice for, what we play for, what we put in all the hard work for, it's. A lot of fun.

Q. Love to be in the lead, but is it more comfortable being just off the pace?

MAX GREYSERMAN: I'd rather be in the lead, right? Comforting or not, I don't think it matters. You just put yourself in position, get enough experience I think just so you just get more and more comfortable in those positions I think is important. Whether you're in the lead or just behind the lead, you're in the mix, that's good experience.

Q. How much fun is it to play in front of this crowd?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, they're great fans, very respectful. They can get pretty rowdy in the U.S., maybe drink too much alcohol. Yeah, I like the Japanese culture. It's my first

time here so yeah, I'm really enjoying it. And yeah, I just kind of like how they're respectful, they clap. You might hit it to 20 feet on an approach and they clap. In the U.S. you need to hit it to a foot or else they're not going to clap.
