Q. Justin, not the result that you wanted. Can you just tell us about your emotions right now and how you're feeling?

I felt like being one back of two people coming into 18 is a tough task to accomplish. I did a lot of the things really well. I made one bogey in 72 holes and had a great chance, just wasn't my week.

Q. This is the second time you finish runner-up at this event. What are you going to take from this result?

JUSTIN THOMAS: A lot of positives. The stuff I've been working on, everything I've been doing is obviously the right stuff and I'm still going the right direction. Just got to keep trying to put myself in contention and right there as often as I can. Just kind of hope for a law of averages thing, eventually you end up getting it done, but it's just about putting yourself there more.

Q. As mentioned, it's your second ZOZO event since 2019. How were the Japanese fans out there today?

JUSTIN THOMAS: They were great. The Japanese fans all week were awesome. I wanted to obviously win it for myself, but I felt a lot of support from the fans out there, so it would have been cool to get it done I feel like for them a little bit.
