CHRISTO LAMPRECHT



Q. Christo, bogey free today, 7 under. I guess what was working well with your game?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: I guess I was a little bit better off the tee today. Put myself in some good positions. I just feel like the conditions were favorable for us in the morning. Besides one or two holes of rain, we didn't have much wind. I feel like the flags were reasonably -- they were set up for the wind this afternoon. We got the better half of it. Yeah, all in all, pretty impressed with the game.

Q. You mentioned that yesterday there was a bit more wind out there. How does that sort of change your strategy when it's a little bit not as windy out there as it was today?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: Yeah, I think it's just if the wind's not blowing, this golf course isn't extremely long, especially for me. So a lot of wedges in your hands and you can go at a lot of flags. If the wind starts blowing, you have to be a little bit more smart of where you leave it. A good shot probably is aiming 15 feet left or 15 feet right of the hole, whereas today I went at a lot of flags. I think that's the big difference, just a lot of close looks today versus yesterday, a lot of longer looks.

Q. You joined Korn Ferry Tour middle of last year off PGA TOUR University. I guess coming into a start of season, I guess where are you at and kind of your mindset going into like a full season or at the beginning of a season?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: Yeah, I think it's really nice to have a full schedule and not start semi on the back foot. Yeah, just be a regular guy out here and having 26, 27 events to play throughout the year, I think that's a great benefit. And obviously with PGA TOUR U having that six months of learning and a lot of figuring out what professional golf is all about, I think that's just awesome. It makes me ready when the year started.

Q. What was your biggest takeaway from when you came onto the Korn Ferry Tour last year?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: The guys make birdies out here. College golf, I mean a three round tournament of college golf, winning score's probably about 10 to 15 under. Out here in four rounds guys are shooting 20, 25 under. They go low on golf courses that aren't gimmee



lows. It's just a little bit of adjustment to that. Yeah, just besides that, it's a lot of golf in professional golf, a lot more than college. Those two are the biggest adjustments, for sure.

Q. You've played well through two rounds, still two to go obviously. Last year Aldrich won out here, also from South Africa. Do you think there's a reason for that, why your guys' games might fit out at this course?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: I think South Africans in general, we're big time feel players. We like to see the ball move differently and I think we're very creative. I think when it gets hard and the wind starts blowing in links golf, South Africans have a really good kind of -- British Open kind of feature as well. I think just when it gets hard and you have to be smart and control your ball flight, that's kind of when we play pretty well.

Q. And how have you been enjoying two weeks here in the Bahamas?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: It is a blast. Yeah, I would love to play all year round right here, it's pretty good.

Q. Do you have a favorite hole out at this course?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: Not a favorite one. I think there's a lot of good ones. I think 18's a great finishing hole. Kind of trouble right and left, and if you hit a good tee shot you can make a nice number. Yeah, I think 18's a great finishing hole.

Q. Are you staying on site this week?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: No, just at the hotel. Pretty neat.

Q. And what do you think it will kind of take going into the weekend here to potentially bring this one home?

CHRISTO LAMPRECHT: Yeah, I think there's a lot of golf still to be played, and depending on what the weather is, I might catch the unlucky break and play in the wind tomorrow. Yeah, it's just one step at a time. It's kind of what my mentality is, for sure.
