ISAIAH SALINDA (-19)

Q. Isaiah, great playing this week. Can you just share some thoughts on how you're feeling right now after the final round?

ISAIAH SALINDA: Yeah, played a great round. Obviously a little disappointed that it came up just one shot short. To at least give myself a chance was all I wanted to do today. I thought honestly being however many back I was, like seven, I knew it was a long shot. Yeah, I can't be too upset about it, I played a good round and just came up one shot short.

Q. How important are events like this and finishes like this when you've earned your card, you're looking to have a great season, finished top-10s going into events like trying to qualify for API and all the great things ahead this season?

ISAIAH SALINDA: Yeah, top-10s are huge out here. That was kind of my primary role going into today is just to lock up a top-10 and get into next week and hopefully PLAYERS and Bay Hill and all those events.

Once I realized I had a chance, I was pretty excited. I just, you know, yeah, I just came up short.

Q. This was your first start here at the Mexico Open. Did you enjoy your week here? I know this is culturally a great place, a great property.

ISAIAH SALINDA: I did. I love this place, this resort's awesome. Big fan of this golf course, I think it suits me really well. Yeah, I love everything about this place.

Q. Just one shot out of the playoff. When you look back on this day, what stands out for you?

ISAIAH SALINDA: I mean, I played a pretty flawless round. I mean, bogey free was all I could really ask for. I honestly just missed like a three-footer on 7 and that ended up being the difference. I made a lot of good putts and hit a lot of good shots so I can't be too upset.

Q. When you think about your season and what this means, you're right on the cusp now, probably have a chance to make the Arnold Palmer Invitational, a Signature Event. There's a lot of things that come in your future. What do you think going into the rest of the season?

ISAIAH SALINDA: I'm just excited. Going into the year I didn't know -- had an idea of how many starts I would get, obviously wasn't getting into the elevated events early and knew I



would have to play my way in eventually. To potentially do that is really cool, so I'm just looking forward to the rest of the year.

Q. What are your emotions coming oh so close to this playoff for possibly your first win on the PGA TOUR?

ISAIAH SALINDA: Yeah, a little disappointed right now that I came up just short, but just proud of the round I played. You know, Sunday having a chance to win is -- all I really wanted to do today was give myself a chance the last few holes and just came up one short, but that's golf. I can't be too upset.

Q. A couple pretty cool up-and-downs on 17 and 18. What did you learn about yourself this week?

ISAIAH SALINDA: Not a ton. I knew that, you know, I knew that my game's good enough to compete and win out here, just a matter of everything coming together. But I felt really good about my game coming in, kind of knew it would be a good week, just came up one short.
