JERRY KELLY: Well, I'm not -- I didn't necessarily feel something pop, but I was one-arm swinging it those last three holes.

Q. You could tell you were uncomfortable yesterday.

JERRY KELLY: It hurt pretty bad and it got worse once I stopped and the adrenaline stopped and got in the trailer. They did a little ultrasound and thought there was a tear, and got an MRI and there's definitely a tear. The surgeon said he wouldn't do summary on it, so that's the good news. Could be back quicker than I thought I was going to be.

Q. I know you struggled last year with a little bit of an injury and you played through it, so hopefully we'll get you back out here pretty soon.

JERRY KELLY: You'll get me back out soon, trust me.

Q. Let's talk about this now. I know that you've been a brand ambassador now for Cologuard for a number of years, but it goes beyond that, just being a sponsor of yours. More personal than that for you right now. Tell us about your involvement with Cologuard and what they're doing.

JERRY KELLY: You know, when I first met Kevin, he was on a flight on his way to one of his relative's funerals who had colon cancer. We just had to get the word out somehow. Even a family member that can die from this, a guy in the highest position in this company.

So all we're trying to do is get people screened early because what I found out, one out of 10 survive late detection, but nine out of 10 survive early detection. But even if it's late detection, stage 4, like my man J.J. over here.

I mean, it's all about the people, you know? It's all about the love everybody shows. And I mean, the amount of energy in this crowd and all the people that are here and all the love. All we need is detection, that's all we need, people following those lines. If you're 45, please get tested. If you have family history, you've got the ability to get tested earlier. It's about screening, catching it early.

This is the second leading cancer between men and women in the United States and we don't talk about it that much. Every other cancer seems to get its day. This is this cancer's

day right here.

Q. And you certainly have gotten the message out. Myself, just walking around through all these people, you can tell they're involved, they love what the message is. Like you said, everybody needs to get tested. I'm 67, we're right there, so we certainly know.

JERRY KELLY: You're way past right there.

Q. I'm way past, I know. I've already been through this whole thing so we're OK.

We appreciate your time, we appreciate your involvement and your passion that you show for Cologuard and colon cancer. Unfortunately you're not playing today so that's an opportunity missed here at 15 because you own this hole. You made four birdies for 1,500 bucks for Cologuard.

JERRY KELLY: Plus, it's coming out of my pocket because I'm pledging \$1,501 for every birdie.
