RYAN FOX (-12)

Q. Ryan, how would you kind of assess your round today?

RYAN FOX: Pretty good, to be honest. It was a scratchy start, bogeyed the first two, didn't hit two very good iron shots into 1 and 2, and from there played really solid. Chip in on 4 and played the back nine about as good as I could play it to be honest, didn't really miss a shot, so I'm pretty happy.

Q. What do you feel like you did the best today in your round?

RYAN FOX: Probably stayed patient. I was a bit angry after starting bogey-bogey and I hit a bad drive on 3 as well. Then kind of gave myself a little talking to and said there's plenty of birdie chances out here, let's just hit a good wedge shot in here and see what happens, and hit it in there close, made birdie and kind of calmed myself down.

Yeah, just turned in even par and got hot on the back nine, and I was proud of myself for staying patient and giving myself lots of chances on that back nine.

Q. When you turned in even par, could you imagine being where you are on the leaderboard heading into Sunday?

RYAN FOX: Yeah. I mean, there's definitely some chances. You know you've got 16 as a good chance downwind. I knew 17 was going to be four so that's a pretty good chance. If you hit good tee shots on the back nine, you can get couple of wedges in. You know, 10, 13, just got to get away with a couple of the harder holes. I hit two great shots into the par 3s, which are the ones that can really trip you up.

Yeah, I knew a decent score was out there. Even after turning at even par I probably had a couple better than I thought I was going to have, but certainly not complaining about that.

Q. What's your mentality when you're chasing someone who might be four, five shots ahead of you? Is there a different mentality maybe when you're chasing maybe when you're a little bit closer to them?

RYAN FOX: Not necessarily. I don't think the game plan changes too much. You've got to take the golf course on a little bit, obviously it's playing really soft at the moment. So it's go out, take some flags on, hope the putter gets hot basically, and if you can put some pressure on early. I've certainly been in the situation Min's been in the other way on the DP World Tour. I think I had a six-shot lead and it was down to one after about five holes after a bad start and a good start from others. Obviously he's a great player and he can control -- I can't



control what he does, but I've just got to go out tomorrow and put some good swings on it and hope I can put some pressure on him and be up there come the last few holes tomorrow afternoon.
