ROUND 4 INTERVIEW

April 6, 2025



JEREMY GANDON (-17, won 1st playoff hole)

Q. Jeremy, congratulations, first Korn Ferry Tour win. What's going through your mind right now? What are the emotions of this?

JEREMY GANDON: Honestly, I don't even know, it's so surreal. I'm trying to sink it in. Haven't given a call yet, so I'm looking forward to that, I'm sure that will be my plus one.

Q. Who are you going to call?

JEREMY GANDON: My wife first, that's probably what it should be, then parents. Maybe they should be asleep but might be awake for good reasons, so we'll see.

Q. I know yesterday you had a great most of your round and then struggled a little bit down the end. What was kind of your self talk kind of last night? How did you spend last night? What did you think about that round and how were you able to refocus into today?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, honestly, probably sounds cliché but I was just kind of staying in the process, approach every shot with the same attention and try to give my best on every shot.

Even today I felt like I struggled a little bit, I didn't have my best game, and towards the end hit a few good shots and the putts went in.

Q. Seventeen was awesome attacking that flag. What was your kind of process, thought process?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, between two clubs, we couldn't really feel the wind there. I knew it was up there and I just kind of teed up a little higher and hit my 8-iron as hard as I could at the flag.

Q. And your bunker shot on the playoff hole, what's going through your mind? What was your thought process?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I mean, (inaudible) hit a good drive. When I had to hit the shot, I just was fully focused on it.

Q. What are some things about this course that helped bring out your best game?

JEREMY GANDON: I think it's a great design. I think at least for me it seems like it was pretty obvious the shot that I wanted to hit off the tee. Once you did that, the putter was hot all week. Yeah, I mean, everything kind of get themselves together for a good week.

Q. You mentioned you might want to buy a house out here one day. How will Savannah always be a special place to you?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, it will definitely be a special place. Yeah, I mean, it's my second time here and people seem to have a great time here, courses are great. If you like golf, you can have a good time here.

Q. How special is it to get that first Korn Ferry Tour win here for you?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, it's big. I was saying earlier, I mean kind of jokingly but not really, after last year I didn't know if I would still play golf. Yeah, so that's the main reason why it's so surreal.

Q. Was there like a backup -- have you ever thought of a backup plan of what you would do if you weren't a pro golfer?

JEREMY GANDON: No. I mean, not really. Kind of the thing I was saying, as long as I can play I knew I would give 100 percent and think about it later. But yeah, I was getting to a point where I needed something to happen and that just happened.

Q. What do you think you would be best at other than -- like in a different profession?

JEREMY GANDON: I don't know. I've been to a few offices, I don't know if I could do that, so maybe something outside.

Q. And could you kind of talk through your Q-School journey last year? I know looking through your stats it seemed like the final day of first stage was super --

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, same thing where, you know, I played that last round of first stage thinking might be the last one of the year and then maybe last one of -- you know, I don't know how many. Then same thing second stage, made on the number, (inaudible) so there's just kind of the stars align I guess.

Q. How much does the win now reaffirm your decision to keep at it and keep playing golf?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I'm finally making a living out of it, so that's a first. (Laughs.) I'm just excited to keep the season going and play some more golf. Yeah, I mean, right now the game's great so you've just got to enjoy when that happens.

Q. Do you know the Augusta National women's a.m. winner, Carla from --

JEREMY GANDON: I don't. I saw that she was a K Stater, but I guess I'm getting old, so I don't, no. But congrats to her, that's awesome.

Q. What were your emotions like going into that final playoff hole driving back to 18 tee box?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, it's just hard to describe, you're just trying to stay in the moment, stay locked in. That was just the main thing. Just whenever I'm hitting a shot, I want to make sure I do it well so I don't have any regrets.

Q. Where are you based out of? Where do you live?

JEREMY GANDON: Dallas.

Q. How long have you been married? Where did you meet your wife?

JEREMY GANDON: So I got engaged last summer in Edmonton, Canada, and then got married in November legally, and we have a big party in January 2026. Legally I'm married, yeah.

Q. Where did you meet?

JEREMY GANDON: She went to TCU and a few of -- when I graduated from K State I moved down to Ft. Worth. A few of my friends were finishing school at TCU. Yeah, met her through mutual friends.

Q. Does she play golf?

JEREMY GANDON: No. I mean, you know, yeah, she can hit it, she's an athlete. She'll pick up the ball real quick if it gets too tough. No, she can hit the ball.

Q. You alluded to kind of wanting to be (inaudible) and it's just not easy to -- playing kind of conditional status and bounce around. What does your wife's support mean to you kind of in the context of this kind of crazy pro golf --

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, she never questioned -- she trusts what I do and she never really questioned the decision I made because she point out that I was doing it for the best. Yeah, her support, you know, I haven't called her yet, I hope she thinks I'm OK (Laughs.)

Yeah, sorry, what was the question?

Q. Your wife's support and what it means to you. In terms of now you're in a good spot to finish top-20 and get your PGA TOUR card, obviously a long way to go, but to

give yourself a kind of good fighting chance of that now just in the context of --

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I haven't even thought about it yet, but yeah, definitely put myself in good position for it. Yeah, I'm just looking forward to the rest of the season really.

Q. What do you remember most about this week?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I don't -- I mean, probably just the last putt that went in, that's a good one. I'm sure some others will come up, but yeah.
