ROUND 4 QUOTES May 25, 2025

DAVIS LAMB (-15)





Q. Davis, Inter Rapidisimo Golf Championship winner, it was an interesting week and you ended up on top. First of all, your thoughts on getting this win, and more importantly, the points to move up to second in the Fortinet Cup.

DAVIS LAMB: Yeah, to get to second is, it's a huge jump. I knew going into this week that a win and some help would get me up there. You never obviously know if it's going to pan out the way that it does. I'm very happy to be standing here. Like you said, a very strange week. I only played for one full day, 36 holes in one day, and just had to sit around today and watch it all unfold completely out of my control. So it's a unique situation but I'm thrilled to be standing here now.

Q. Abel Gallegos put the pressure on today with a great final round, and you were there tracking it at the end and it came down to the final hole.

DAVIS LAMB: It did. Nothing but respect for Abel, an amazing round. To go out and know that you need to post a number like that and to go out and almost do it is amazing, so I've got nothing but respect for Abel.

Like you said, I was there watching that last hole and my heart was beating out of my chest. It's an interesting thing in golf when you have no control over the outcome because at least usually on a Sunday you are playing the same group or within a couple of groups of the person who's chasing you or leading. So to just wake up this morning in the hotel while he's playing, get breakfast while he's playing and just watch him put more and more birdies on the board, it was a situation that I'm entirely unaccustomed to. I'm very happy it worked out in my favor, but it was an awfully stressful day.

Q. This is on record an official win, you get the points, you get the money, you move up near the top of the standings. So that's what you guys are really playing for.

DAVIS LAMB: Sure. You know, obviously as far as wins go, this feels different, it feels unique. But like you said, whatever we can do, we've got to fight and claw for every point we can get. Once we got the green light we were going to play golf this week, we knew we were going to have 36 holes and points and money were all in play, it was go time. I was just very happy to put up a good couple rounds yesterday and here we are now.

Q. That opening round, 11 under, shooting 7 under on the par 5s, making two eagles, it was huge. It made a huge difference in getting this.



DAVIS LAMB: Yeah, it was huge because my second round, realistically it was solid and nothing more than that. I would have loved to maybe get a couple more. I think today I could have relaxed a bit more if I got to 16 or 17, which was very realistic. But when you put up a good round like that, especially when there's only two of them, you put yourself in a great position. It was a special round. I certainly never played par 5s on a golf course 7 under in one round, but the chips fell in my favor and here we are.

Q. How does this compare to Bromont, which was an official win, but you're still a winner here today? How's it compare to that especially after maybe going through some struggles?

DAVIS LAMB: Yeah, to be honest, I'm still trying to make sense of it all. This is my third win on this tour, or this type of tour, and I've never won without there being a rain delay, so there's something to that. I've never won without Jay here.

After going through a year like last year was where certainly my finishes weren't what I wanted them to be but at no point did I feel like my game was way off. That's just a testament to how good that tour is.

It was tough to come to terms with the fact that I was essentially being relegated to come back to this tour. I love this tour, I love the people, but it's a different animal. My goal this year was to come out and play the best golf that I could and hope that things worked out in my favor. A weird week like this, only 36 holes all in one day, waiting around, I just told myself it doesn't matter, everyone's playing the same thing, let's go out there and beat everybody.

Q. When you talk about confidence, momentum, all that kind of stuff, what does this do for you, and looking forward to the rest of 2025?

DAVIS LAMB: It puts me in a really good spot points wise. Looking forward to a little bit of a break here, it's been a long six weeks playing down here.

I'm going to be going become up to D.C. and playing some golf with my friends up there. Me and my dad are playing the member-member at our home course, I'm really excited about that. Then just got to get ready to go to Canada. We've got a whole new crop of guys coming onto this tour this summer, so it's not going to get any easier. So my goal is to win the points list. I'm going to go out there and do everything I can to do that.

Q. How excited do you think your dad is to know you're this hot now, you're going to that tournament with him?

DAVIS LAMB: He's going to need the help. He's been talking about how bad his golf game is for about eight months. I don't know how the strokes are going to work out, but hopefully we have some sort of chance. I'm just excited to get out there with him. I try to give him



pointers, but he doesn't always listen.

Q. And one more about confidence. You won in Canada, you win down here, different types of conditions. Just what does this do for your confidence just knowing that you can win in different types of conditions, situations, elevations, weather?

DAVIS LAMB: Yeah, it's interesting because you see on a day like days like the last couple were very windy and wet and rain coming in and out. There are some days when you're playing like this and you feel great to shoot like 2 or 3 under, and you really do. It's just a matter of you get it on the right day, you're playing the right way, the conditions work out in your favor, you have the right numbers, all that. In a way, you need to be aware that the conditions aren't in your control and that some days are going to be better than others.

So I came out yesterday and got off to a great start and just figured, hey, it might be my day, and we just kind of kept it rolling.

So I don't put too much stock into how I feel on a certain day or conditions or anything like that. It's just a matter of do the best you can every day and some days it will work out, some days it won't.

I felt like I played great this whole year frankly. My weekends haven't been everything that I've wanted them to be, but you just need to be ready to seize the opportunity when it comes, and I feel like I did that this week and I've done that on this tour. So I'm just looking forward to moving on and hopefully taking the next step next year.

Q. Jay was saying that you had a bunch of players surrounding you for that winning moment. Who were you with and what does it mean to share in a moment like that?

DAVIS LAMB: Yeah, we had a couple guys that were just basically sweating the end out for different reasons, and we went out there just to watch him finish. Some of them are still in there sweating as the guys finish playing, but it's nice to have different players out there. Everyone supports everyone out here. If one of them was out here vying for the win, I'd be right next to him also. So it's nice camaraderie. You need to have some friendships on a tour like this because if you're just trying to roll solo for six weeks down here, you're going to have a pretty bad time.

Q. The ultimate goal is to make the top-10, being one of the 10 at the end of the season, but what you have logged through this is a conditional card for the Korn Ferry Tour through 2026 and you have also logged spots in the first four events of the Korn Ferry Tour in Latin America, Panama, Columbia, Argentina, Chile. So it's a good spot in the right direction. Also, last year the two guys who finished first and second made the top-10, which is also promising, the position you are in right now.

DAVIS LAMB: Sure, yeah. So if nothing else, it's a great place to be. To be quite frank with you, I told myself that at the end of this year that if I didn't have some form of Korn Ferry



status that I'd probably hang 'em up. To lock that up in whatever month that is, May, is a big step.

I'm really looking forward to those events in South America. I played 'em all last year and had a great time, especially in Chile. Yeah, the goal is No. 1, 100 percent. I'm not satisfied by any stretch. It's nice to have that in my back pocket, but I'm going to go out there and try to win the rest of this tour just so that I can get the No. 1 and the full guarantee card.

Q. You're at the point in your career where you're a couple years in, you've seen your peers excel, make the PGA TOUR, you've beaten a lot of players that are now on the PGA TOUR. How bad do you want to make the PGA TOUR?

DAVIS LAMB: So bad, so bad. That's why we all do this, right? I've loved playing this tour and the Korn Ferry, but the ultimate goal is to make it up to the top, to the PGA TOUR.

As of right now, it's a long way away, but I feel like I'm putting myself in positions that I can do it in a reasonable amount of time. So I'm just going to keep doing what I'm doing. I feel like I have a really, really good plan, really good coaching around me, really good people kind of helping me through it. Just looking forward to the rest of this year and the years to come to see where I can go.
