DAVIS CHATFIELD (-14)



Q. Davis, great round. You're going to be in the mix going into tomorrow. Just sort of walk me through some of the highlights of the round today and the challenge that it presented.

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Yeah, obviously it's very challenging out there, the wind was pretty brutal especially on the back nine. Got off to a bit of a slow start and then kickstarted it with a birdie on 6 and I think I made four or five in a row from there. I felt really good going into today. I'm glad that I didn't let the bogey on 4 kind of derail the round, I reset and played really good golf from there on in.

Q. What's the course been like for you this week? A lot of guys talking about the Donald Ross layout, the classic layout. Do you enjoy this style of course that we're playing this week?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Yeah, kind of feels like home, to be honest. I grew up on a Donald Ross course, Wannamoisett Country Club in Rhode Island. These slopes and everything kind of feel like home to me. I enjoy this type of course. Yeah, when you mix the wind in with it, it's very tough.

Q. You've been in this position quite a bit this year. What have you done between your first year out here and then this year where you've really broken out to kind of put yourself in this position so many times?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Yeah, I think experience has gone a long way for me. I haven't really made too many changes to my game, I think I'm just making a couple less mistakes a round and that goes a long way out here.

As far as going into tomorrow, I'm just going to control what I can control and keep it simple out there. I'm in a great spot going into tomorrow and I'm looking forward to it.

Q. What's the biggest thing that you've learned from being in this position so many times this year?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: You don't have to play perfect golf to be in contention. I always thought you had to. You just have to miss it in the right spots and make few bogeys. I didn't really do that last week, but this week I didn't make any bogeys throughout the first two

rounds. Just really confident going into tomorrow and I like where my game's at.

Q. Is there anything in particular like when you get in one of those last groups that you kind of have to like watch out for like within yourself, like if you're moving too fast or something like that?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Yeah, I think in years prior if I was in that position I would definitely catch myself moving a little too quick. Now that I know that I have a tendency to do that, I can catch it a little bit earlier.

So yeah, tomorrow's going to be a great day. It's going to be fun being in contention and I'm just going to embrace it.

Q. It's a very simple question, but what would it mean to win out here?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: It would be very cool. Yeah, that's why I work so hard, why I play and practice out here. I mean, I want to win. I don't tee it up to come in second. Winning would be awesome, it would just be -- yeah, I think I said this in Mexico, it would be the result of a long process.

Q. What do you think the toughest thing to do tomorrow is going to be?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Stay mentally sharp. If I get out to a start like I did today, I can't let it affect the next shot. Just got to stay mentally sharp the whole way and whatever that brings, it will bring.

Q. What do you think the easiest thing to do tomorrow will be?

DAVIS CHATFIELD: I don't think anything's going to be easy, to be honest with you. Yeah, I've just got to go out there and play my game and not focus on anyone else.
