**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS (-15)**

**Q. Preston, 6-under 65 today, just what's been working this whole week?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** I feel like I've managed my game really well this week. The first two days I didn't feel like I really drove it well or hit it that great, but I scored pretty well and made a decent amount of putts.

And then today I just kind of felt like I hit a couple more fairways, hit a couple shots tighter and just made a couple easier birdies off some wedge shots.

**Q. Standing inside the top-10 now for the second time in third starts after 54 holes, were you expecting this type of debut out here?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** Honestly, I wasn't really -- didn't really have any expectations. I have confidence in my game to come out here and compete to the best of my abilities. It's just nice to kind of be at the top of the leaderboard and hopefully we just go take it one shot at a time tomorrow and see where we end up.

**Q. You want to talk about PGA TOUR University a little bit, just how much it means to come out here on the Korn Ferry Tour right away?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** Yeah, I mean, PGA TOUR U is great. I mean, I'm loving it right now. Otherwise I'd probably be just trying to get sponsors exemptions into events and try to get my card or status that way, but it's really nice to come out of college and have a place to play. I'm very lucky to be playing golf at the time that I'm playing.

**Q. And obviously you come from a professional family. Has there been any adjustments or any tips that they've helped you with coming out here?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** My dad, he's trained me really, really hard from a very young age and I think that works in my favor. I've been fortunate enough and lucky enough to have had a decent amount of starts, professional starts, some Tour events, Korn Ferry, U.S. Open. I feel like I played a lot as an amateur, that way once I'm out here I'm pretty comfortable.

**Q. I saw that your uncle, Daniel, I believe, played this event a couple of times. Did you get to speak to him?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** I haven't spoken to him about this event, no. But I did see him at U.S. Open qualifying a couple weeks ago and he said he was going to try to get back out in a couple weeks. I hope that he comes out here soon and we can get some practice round together and hopefully some final groupings together.

**Q. And you briefly mentioned it, but what is it, the all black fit?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** All black fit, it's kind of attribute to my dad. Kind of anybody who knows him in the golfing world knows that his go-to outfit is black on black on black. If you look in his closet, there's not one colored shirt, it's just all black. My dad means so much to me and he's been just such -- he's one of my best friends, so this is kind of attribute to him, this all black outfit.

**Q. Can you talk about being able to play in a bunch of pro events as an amateur but now that you're actually a pro, is there anything different?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** I would say it's different in the sense where when you're an amateur and you're playing college events and amateur events, whenever you get a Tour start, it feels like a big opportunity, and it probably puts a little bit more pressure on you just because that's your one shot. It's not like you're playing an entire season and you know you're going to have a couple hot weeks. It's like you're trying to play good because you get the opportunity.

Now, since I have full status for the rest of the year, it's just kind of a normal tournament.

**Q. Were there any adjustments to it? The travel, the dog everything on your own, any adjustments to that, or just having the ability to play all these pro events you kind of learn?**

**PRESTON SUMMERHAYS:** Yeah, I wouldn't say that there's so many adjustments. I'd say I have a great team around me that handles all my travel and all of the stuff kind of behind the scenes. That way I can just focus on golf, and I'm very grateful for that.
