JASON CARON (-10)

Q. All right, Jason, another great round. Clean front, a little bit rocky on the back, but you rallied there at the end to put yourself in contention tomorrow. Just assess your round after the delay.

JASON CARON: Yeah, after the delay it was not so great, but before the delay was good. Hit it good, putted the ball well, good speed control, and then in the delay, just before it happened I hit a bad tee ball. My back's been a little bit tight this week, and just maybe a couple shots I kind of hit to the right this week which I've noticed.

But overall, after that I made a good save for a birdie I guess you could say on 16 because it's a drivable hole. And then 17, hit a really nice 8-iron in there and made the putt. Again, overall I'm very pleased with where I stand, for sure.

Q. How do you feel -- potentially looks like you're going to be playing in the final group tomorrow, so seeking that first win, just what's the strategy going into tomorrow?

JASON CARON: I'm just going to do what I've been doing, which is just trying to control what I can do and not what everyone else does, have fun. I've got my family out here, so it's always nice to see them on the sidelines, and they're always cheering regardless if it's a birdie or a triple bogey, you wouldn't even know.

No, it's great. Listen, I would love to win a tournament out here. Playing in the last group's always good because it kind of gets you down the line maybe some opportunities that may come up and be ready for it. I'm just going to try my best and see what happens.

Q. When you have a weather delay and you were on a roll for quite a bit and you got that pause, how do you regain that momentum that Mother Nature kind of shuts down for you?

JASON CARON: You can go either way, to be honest. I knew I was probably going to make bogey on my first one, and then I didn't hit a great shot on the next hole, then all of a sudden kind of fired back up a little bit there after 15.

You just kind of hang in there. You know everyone's got to deal with it in that little wave of tee times, so everyone has to try it and do it. So you just try to work your magic if you will and just kind of hang in there.

I had a great group with Tim O'Neal out there, I always have fun playing with him. It was kind



of easy to kind of get that going again. It was so hot, too, which kind of helps, so all good.
