JOSH TEATER (+3)



Q. Josh, after the second weather delay, did the course change at all the last couple holes that you played?

JOSH TEATER: I think, you know, that little bit of rain, there was a little bit of skip on like Jackson's wedge shot in there on 16, but other than the wind calming down, I think the course would be pretty similar. I don't think there's much of that rain that's going to soften it up too much. To not deal with the wind is an advantage I would say.

Q. Just talk a little bit about your round. You had it pretty good and then you made that double.

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, I started out poorly really. I hit a great drive on 1, which is the hard part on that hole, and then a gap wedge. I've kind of been trying to start my ball a little bit more online. I felt like I did some good work this morning, and they were starting too far left and got me in trouble for most of the day. Put myself in tough spots, was fighting.

Birdied 10, birdied I guess 12 and was back to 2 over. Or 14, sorry. And then just hit another poor iron shot on 15 in the water when it really wasn't in play. Wish the delay might have come about 20 minutes earlier and we wouldn't have hit that one in there.

Q. For you, what is the goal going into Sunday? What would be a great day for you?

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, I think just going out, stick to my plan and, you know, get it back in the red, shoot -- if I can shoot 3, 4, 5 under, you know, get back to a few under par and gain momentum going into next week.

Q. Was there ever a point that you thought you might not finish your round today due to the weather?

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, I didn't do a whole lot of looking at the radars or the forecast, but everybody was saying like there's a chance we won't get back out there tonight. That's kind of what I was prepared for, but very thankful that we did get finished so I'm probably not going to start until afternoon tomorrow I think.

Q. Talk to me about the kids at the end right there. You gave away a lot of balls, signed a lot of stuff. They're pretty happy about it.

JOSH TEATER: Yeah. I mean, I was those kids one day. You know, I know those balls and gloves probably mean a lot, might get them to play golf if they're not already.



Yeah, you know, bad day doesn't mean the world's going to end. Thinking I can share those balls. They weren't very good to me, so maybe they'll do better for them. I've got a fresh batch in the locker we'll go with tomorrow.
